*Friday February 1<sup>st</sup>*  
*Barrel of Sugar & Case of Cheese* This Day begins with strong winds from N.W. and thick weather. At 6 P.M. bore the ship too in a Gale of wind. Latter parts winds and weather much the same as the first. Nothing in sight remarkable. Lying too in a Gale of wind. So ends. No Ob.

*Saturday February 2<sup>d</sup>*  
 This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and thick rainy weather. Latter parts winds and weather much the same as the first. At 7 A.M. set double reefed Top Sails. Nothing in sight. So ends. Lat Ob. 38. 41 E.

*Sunday February 3<sup>d</sup>*  
 This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and thick rainy weather. Latter parts strong Gales from N.W. and heavy weather. Ship under double reefed Top Sails. Nothing in sight. So ends. Long by Chron 9. 53. W. Lat Ob. 39. 35 E.

*Monday February 4<sup>th</sup>*  
*Sixty of Molasses* This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and heavy rainy weather. At 4 P.M. made Joseph's Island bearing S.W. Dis 7 leagues. Latter parts calm and pleasant. So ends. The Day.

*Tuesday February 5<sup>th</sup>*  
*Barrel of Beef & Pork* This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. The natives employed in mending sails. Latter parts strong Gales from N.W. and thick rainy weather. Nothing in sight. So ends. The Day.

*On a Whaling Cruise to the Cape of Good Hope 1833*

*Wednesday February 6<sup>th</sup>*  
 This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and thick weather. Latter parts light winds from N.E. and thick weather with some rain. Nothing in sight. So ends. The Day. No Ob.

*Thursday February 7<sup>th</sup>*  
 This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and thick rainy weather with a heavy sea on. Latter parts strong Gale from N.W. and squally weather. Nothing in sight. Lying too in a Gale of wind. So ends. Lat Ob. 42. 38 E.

*Friday February 8<sup>th</sup>*  
 This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and squally weather with a heavy sea on. Latter parts strong Gale from N.W. and thick weather. Lying too in a Gale of wind. So ends. No Ob.

*Saturday February 9<sup>th</sup>*  
*Barrel of Fat* This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and thick rainy weather. Latter parts winds the same and pleasant weather. At 7 A.M. raised two white whales lowered ~~from~~ struck them both and killed them. So ends. No Ob.

*Sunday February 10<sup>th</sup>*  
 This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. At 3 P.M. took one whale to the ship. At 4 P.M. began to cut. Two hours later by the other all night. At 4 A.M. finished cutting one. At 6 A.M. came in thick fog. cut from the whale and came on board. So ends. Thick fog. No Ob.
