Friday March 1st

Barril of. This Day begins with light winds from S.S.W. and
Blow. pleasant weather. Latter parts winds and weather much
the same as the first. Ship under all sail steering N.
by E. The watch employed in ships duty. So ends
Long by Chron. 2.10 W. Lat. 46. 29. 35 S.

Saturday March 2^d

This Day begins with light winds from S.S.W. and
pleasant weather. At 4 A.M. crept the main royal
yard and set the sail. Latter parts light winds
from S.S.W. and squally. Ship under all sail
steering N.E. Nothing in sight. So ends.
Long by Chron. 1.41 W. Lat. 46. 27. 43 S.

Sunday March 3^d

This Day begins with light winds from S.S.W.
and squally weather. Latter parts winds and
weather much the same as the first. Ship under
all sail steering N.E. So ends The Day.
Long by Chron. 1.59 W. Lat. 46. 25. 40 S.

Monday March 4th

This Day begins with strong winds from
S.E. and squally weather. Latter parts much
the same as the first. Ship under all sail steering
N.E. So ends The Day. No Ob.

Tuesday March 5th

This Day begins with strong winds from S.E.
and pleasant weather. Latter parts winds and
weather much the same as the first. Ship under
all sail steering North. So ends.
Long by Chron. 3.14 W. Lat. 46. 21. 23 S.

Wednesday March 6th

This Day begins with strong winds from S.E. and
pleasant weather. Latter parts much the same as the
first. Ship under all sail steering N.E. So ends.
Long by Chron. 3.41 W. Lat. 46. 19. 39 S.

Thursday March 7th

This Day begins with light winds from S.E.
and pleasant weather. Latter parts winds and
weather much the same as the first. Ship under
all sail steering N.E. The watch employed in ships
duty. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends.
Long by Chron. 5.12 W. Lat. 46. 18. 05 S.

Friday March 8th

Barril of. This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and
Blow. pleasant weather. Latter parts strong winds from
S.E. and pleasant weather. Ship under all sail
steering N.E. At 10 A.M. made the Island of St.
Helena bearing per compass 66 by 1. Dist 10 leagues.
from which I take a departure. So ends.
Long by Chron. 7.10 W. Lat. 46. 15. 55 S.

Saturday March 9th

This Day begins with strong winds from S.S.E.
and pleasant weather. At 11 A.M. saw a sail steer-
ing southward and westward with a light set.
Latter parts winds and weather much the
same as the first. Ship under all sail steer-
ing N.E. The watch employed in ships duty. So
ends. Long by Chron. 8.56 W. Lat. 46. 14. 31 S.
