This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. Latter parts strong winds from S.E. and thick rainy weather. Ship under all sail steering N.W. by W. So ends this Day's work.

Wednesday March 20th

This Day begins with strong winds from S.E. and hazy weather. Latter parts light winds and thick rainy weather. At 10 A.M. a police ship Pharo of and from London, 25 days out bound to Barn Bay, Ship under all sail steering N.W. by W. One suit in sight. So ends This Day's work.

Thursday March 21st

This Day begins with light winds from E.S.E. and hazy weather. Latter parts calm and rainy. One suit in sight. So ends.
Lat Obs. 00. 50 N.

Friday March 22^d

Barrel of. This Day begins with calm and squalls of rain. Clear. At 5 P.M. a light breeze from E.S.E. and rainy. Latter parts light winds from N.E. to N.W. and thick rainy weather. At 8 A.M. saw a Brig steering to sea. Throat and westward. So ends.

Barrel of. This Day begins with light winds and variable Breeze. Thick rainy weather. Latter parts calm and squalls of rain. So ends.

This Day begins with a light breeze from S.E. to West, and thick rainy weather. Latter parts calm and rainy till 8 A.M. a light breeze from N.W. to S.E. and pleasant weather. Ship under all sail steering N.W. by W. So ends.
Long by Chron. 26. 12 M. Lat Obs. 2. 34 N.

Tuesday March 26th

This Day begins with light winds from S.E. to N.E. and pleasant weather. Latter parts light winds from N.E. to East. Ship under all sail steering N.W. by W. The watch employed in bundling home. So ends.
Long by Chron. 26. 04 M. Lat Obs. 2. 58 N.

Wednesday March 27th

This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. Latter parts calm and rainy. At 10 A.M. a light wind from E.S.E. and pleasant. Ship under all sail steering N.W. by W. So ends.
Lat Obs. 3. 09 N.

Thursday March 28th

This Day begins with light winds from E.S.E. and hazy weather. Latter parts strong winds from N.E. and hazy weather. Ship under all sail steering N.W. by W. The watch employed in ships duty. So ends.
