Wednesday April 17th
 Tack of. This Day begins with strong winds from S.W. and
 Broad heavy weather. Latter parts strong winds from N.E.
 and pleasant weather. Ship under all sail steering
 N.W. The watch employed in ship duty. So ends.
 Long by Chron. 61. 14 W. L.H. Obs. 26. 30 N.

Thursday April 18th
 This Day begins with light winds from N.E.
 and pleasant weather. Latter parts light winds
 from East and pleasant weather. Ship under all
 sail steering N.W. 1/2 N. So ends.
 Long by Chron. 61. 31 W. L.H. Obs. 27. 42 N.

Friday April 19th
 This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and
 pleasant weather. Latter parts light winds from
 South and pleasant weather. The watch emp-
 loyed in cooping a new Fore Top Sail yard.
 The Old one was sprung in a squall some time
 ago. Ship steering N.W. 1/2 N. So ends.
 Long by Chron. 62. 31 W. L.H. Obs. 28. 24 N.

Saturday April 20th
 Banned of. This Day begins with light winds from W.S.W.
 Breeze of. and pleasant weather. A sun down Fore sail
 Breeze of. in sight to southward and westward of us.
 Latter parts light winds and heavy weather. At 6
 A.M. saw a brig heading to the southward and west-
 ward. Ship under all sail. That is required
 by the winds. So ends.

Sunday April 21st
 This Day begins with light winds from West and heavy
 weather. Latter parts calm and clear. So ends.
 Long by Chron. 62. 45 W. L.H. Obs. 29. 26 N.

Monday April 22nd
 This Day begins with calm and clear weather.
 Latter parts strong winds from S.W. and heavy wea-
 ther. At 5 A.M. saw a brig heading to the southward
 and eastward. Ship under all sail steering N.W. 1/2 S.
 So ends. Long by Chron. 63. 34 W. L.H. Obs. 30. 06 N.

Tuesday April 23rd
 This Day begins with strong winds from S.W. and
 heavy weather. At 3 P.M. saw a ship heading to the
 southward and eastward. Latter parts calm. So
 ends. Long by Chron. 64. 27 W. L.H. Obs. 30. 51 N.

Wednesday April 24th
 This Day begins with light winds from S.W. and
 squally weather. Saw a number of Flump Back
 whale. Latter parts strong winds and squally
 weather. Ship under such sail as is required by the
 weather. Steering N.W. 1/2 W. Two sail in sight.
 So ends. Long by Luner Obs. 65. 23 W.
 Long by Chron. 65. 50 W. L.H. Obs. 32. 05 S.

Thursday April 25th
 This Day begins with strong winds from S.W. and
 pleasant weather. Latter parts strong winds from S.W.
 to N.W. and heavy weather. At 5 A.M. saw a brig heading to the eastward
 At 11 A.M. spoke Brig Sarah & Geraldine of Boston bound to
 Cuba, her long 67. 00 W. So ends. Long by Chron. 66. 27 W.
 Long by Luner Obs. 66. 33 W. L.H. Obs. 33. 42 N.
