Gulls & other birds employed in ships duty
middle and latter parts strong gales of
wind squalls with heavy rain & squalls
The topsails took in at 5 P.M. To write that we have
Lat 40.35 N Longitude 95.17 W -

August
3^d
1885

On muzzes with strong pale green. 2nd ones
at 1/2 pm. 1st. The 2nd better yet smaller.
All the middle and latter the same.
1st. up the main tack, purr as you
filled them so much. 2nd 1/2 pm. 1st.

Tuesday
August
4th
1885

Commenced with strong wind
P.W. came & L.D. at 2 pm. Got up the
Boat hook and came at 4 pm took in
Lophogadris all the middle and latter part
blowing squally weather so at 9 am Paul &
I left them sperm whales got the
lines in the boat & squall came lost the
line of them so ends this 24 hours at 4 P.M.

August
3rd
1835

This 24 hours commences with
drizzle squalls & rain from the 10th until
1 P.M. & all the middle and latter part
strong winds saw several sails to end the
hovein Latt 40.00 long 50.00 ft

Tuesday

Commenced with gentle breeze from S.W.
on 11. 1896 hands employed in ship's duty.
At 8 pm raised H.M.S. standing to the
