October
18th 1835

This 24 hours commences with light
breezes from W & W. came S by S. Under
The foretop sail and kept another
breezed the main top gansail. Commenced
upon the 7th top sail. Middle part
Commenced with a gale from W
came down to a reef top sails late
Part the same. S ends sent from
a mast and yard Lat 32.34 S Long 12.10 W

Friday
October
19th 1835

Commences with gales from W
Came S by S. Under 2 reef
Gale heavy sea running middle part
The day a latter part wind
The south S ends Lat 33.20 S Long 12.10 W

Saturday
October
20th 1835

This 24 hours commences with gentle
breezes from S and thick cloudy
weather steering of the wind upon
Star tack at 5 pm made all sail
Middle part light winds from
SSE latter the same tacked and
steered to the S by W. Down the
begin top gansail and sent up the
S ends Lat 32.41 S Long 12.20 W

Sunday
October 18th
1835

Commences with light winds
SSE star S by W. The
Latter quarter boat a
with the middle an
Strong winds and
breezes Lat 34.30 S Long 12.48 W

Monday
October 19th
1835

Commences with the same kind
of weather but colder. At 2 pm saw
a breacher saw it but saw all the
middle and latter part
Spoke the ship Lady Flora of Gordon
Bound to India. Painted the
Star quarter boat. Nothing more
S ends Lat 36.21 S Long 17.50 W

20th 1835

This 24 hours commences with gentle
breezes from S star S by S. Under
The lar tack hands employed in ships
Duty all the middle and latter part
Fine weather S ends Lat 34.30 S Long 12.48 W

Saturday
October
21st 1835

Commences with fine weather. Whales
Saw one of the Islands. Saw 3
3 pm saw a three boat and a whale
Round and round till sunset but no
Saw 4 in the morning ship at 1 pm
Tack in the morning all the middle
and latter part strong wind S ends
Latitude 37.8 S Longitude 19.20 W

Sunday
October 21st
1835

Commences with strong gales from
NNE star S by S under 8 top sails
The islands bearing short & distant
10 leagues hands employed in ships
Duty S ends at 5 pm saw 2 whales
At 5 pm took in fore and main to
and a sea too made 4 water
All the latter part strong gales to end
Lat 37.50 S Long 12.50 West

Monday
October 22nd
1835

Commences with strong gales
from N and vary buff at 4 pm
Took in sail and lay to strong
flashed with showers of rain S
middle and latter part fine weather
Saw 1 ship to the NW of us. S ends
Latitude 37.20 S Long 12.35 W

Tuesday
October 23rd
1835

Commences with fine weather
gentle breeze from SW star S by S
Employed in ships duty at 5 pm
Saw the land the island middle and latter
part fine weather saw a whale land and
chased but to no purpose saw 1 sail
Nothing more S ends this 24 hours
Latitude 37.15 S Long 12.20 W
