Novem^r
the 4th
1835

Running to the Eastward

Commenced with fine weather
and calm sea after the whales
struck me. Stear 1 boat at
9 pm took under long side
At 6 am began sailing at 12 Finnish
S. ends Lat^d 57° 22' Long^d 51° 8'

Thursday
Novem^r
the 5th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with strong
winds from N.W. coars & light ball
heads employed in boiling middle
at strong winds but fine weather
Clear but showing a
gale continue sailing to ends latitude
37° 30' S Long^d 55° 56'

Friday
Novem^r
the 6th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with a
gale from the N.W. by day to sailing
under Pilot with main topsail and
spencers heading to the East at 8 pm
came on squally with rain so that
we had to come down at 8 pm
Commenced again sailing wind
blatid sun set the foresail to end
Lat^d 37° 25' Long^d 56° 8'

Saturday
Novem^r
the 7th
1835

Commenced with strong winds from
W. southerly and a heavy swell
continue sailing at 6 pm Finnish
Stear 8 S.E. under 2 reef fore &
main topsails & foresail 3 c
All the middle and latter part
strong gale with rain hands stopped
In showing down to ends this 24 hours
Latitude 37° 25' Long^d 56° 8'

Sunday
Novem^r
the 8th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with strong
gales from the N.W. Stear 8 S.E. at 5 pm
Finnish showing do in took in 7 pm
Topsails and Stear to 8 all the middle
and latter parts strong winds and
equally heavy swell from N.W. at 5 pm
Latitude 36° 55' S Long^d 54° 5'

Monday
Novem^r
the 9th
1835

Working to the East

This 24 hours commenced with strong
winds from the W. with a heavy
swell from N.W. Stear 8 S.E. at 5 pm
Shortened sail as usual all the middle
and latter parts strong gales and
equally saw whales lobed but lost
The iron of line so ends this 24 hours
Lat^d 37° 7' S Long^d 57° 30' W

Tuesday
Novem^r
the 10th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with
strong gales and reef at 4 pm
Saw 84 whale loard and struck
brooke one over the iron broke and
then the went off came on board
took in sail and fasted too all the
middle and latter parts strong gales
from W so ends lat^d 37° 55' Long^d 58°

Wednesday
Novem^r
the 11th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with strong
gales from the coars N.E. at 1 pm under
the foresail to wind at 2 pm saw whale
at 3 pm saw 2 finbacks off ship
Shortened sail as usual in headed
to the N.W. middle and latter
parts strong gales S. ends latitude
37° 00' S Long^d 58° 49'

Thursday
Novem^r
the 12th
1835

This 24 hours commenced with strong
gales from SW at 1 pm took the
foresail at 4 pm became squally
with showers coars N.E. at 6 pm
Shortened sail as usual middle
and latter parts strong gales at 7 pm kept off
at 8 pm saw a whale lost
at 9 pm took in the topsail
at 10 pm took in the foresail
at 11 pm took in the topsail
