Cruising for Whales

This 24 hours commences with fine weather and gentle breezes from SW at 4 pm. Dr. sail. At 7 pm spoke the G. like Cap deckstr. 5 1/2 miles out with 8 W. wind 180 on. Theron he came on board at 9 pm. he went on board middle and latter parts fine weather saw whales dead but to no success At 12 Midday struck a small whale took him along side To end this 24 hours Lat 36° 50' Long 9° 30' 8

Commenced with fine weather
Commenced cutting at 5 pm
Had pine cut in the store
Ship to the windward and got it
Whale at 8 pm Commenced
Boiling all the middle and
Latter part fine weather
Whales 20 crabs 20 lobsters 10 fish

Commenced with fine weather
Continue boiling at 2 pm Saw
Whales Load put the kettles
They did not get on at 4 pm
4 ships in sight at 8 pm
Boiling 20 hrs all the middle and
latter parts Strong wind Saw 6 ships
Sum of them commencing Nothing
More to end with 35° 38' W Long 78° 00'

Commenced with a wind from
S.W. at 5 pm. The
The first of the day I saw
At 5 the G. was taken in the
Puttering all the middle and latter
Parts taking the weather from
Ship. Looking more to the
24 hours. Altitude 35° 30' Long 110° 10'

Cruising upon the Eastern
Front

This 24 hours commences with strong breezes from the SSW. Steady to the SE at 8 pm. Shorten sail as usual nothing seen from West-head of any consequence. All the middle and latter part the same. Saw whals board twice between 7 and 12 but to no purpose. So ends this 24 hours with 35th 45th 5th 11th 6th

Commenced with fine weather but
At 11 swell saw several finbacks
wind blowing from S & W
Star. 18 at 3 pm saw 2 seal to S.W.
Standing to the N.W. made and
latter part fine weather saw 2 great
many whales heard 4 times shot
once 100 lbs iron 20 guns this 24
Lat 36° 30' S Long 12° 30' W

Commences with fine weather. Gale
blows from the South clear.
At 4 pm saw 2 sail off the
star beam and 6 whales all the time
and latter part fine weather. Saw 4 sail
to end this 24 hours sail S. by S. Long Is.

Commenced with fine weather Earth
reeves from 8 am to 12 pm
Saw from the mast head a small
consequence at 6 pm spoke the Russian
Cap Goodin Cap went on board Double head
The horizon at 8 pm all the middle and later
Two fine waves to our latitude 55° 30' S 130°

Commences with fine weather Saw Black
Fish boats and got 2 at 4 pm spoke
The Percebees again. Exp. came on board
All the middle and latter parts fine
And pleasant weather Saw hump backs
Nothing more of any consequence
Ends this 24 hours Left 11.30 A.M. South
Long 110 13.30 E
