Nov 23rd
1835

Cruising Upon the Eastern Green

This 24 hours commences with fine weather and gentle breezes from S at 4 pm hauled farther W tack. And stood to the S at 8 pm. Became thick and overcast. All the middle and latter part fine weather till the oil between decks. Nothing more so ends this 24 hours. Latitude 36° 40' S Longitude 14° 12' E

Tuesday
Nov 24th
1835



This 24 hours commenced with fine breezes from the N.W. steered upon the star tack at 4 pm. Saw hump backs middle and latter part fine weather. Saw whales. Long. And chased but to no success. Ends Latitude 36° 44' S Long 15° 50' E

Wednesday
Nov 25th
1835



This 24 hours commenced with strong winds from N.W. steered W at 4 pm saw whales. Boarded got on once but to no success. At sunset saw a number of whales. All the middle part fine weather. Latter part strong wind saw a whale. Land out to no success. At 11 AM saw a dead whale took him along side. So ends Latitude 36° 48' S Long 15° 50' E

Thursday
Nov 26th
1835

This 24 hours commences with a heavy Gale cut in the whale gear. Began boiling. At 12 middle part took in the foresail. Heavy Gale with a hy sea continued all the latter part so ends Latitude 36° 20' S Long 15° 00' E

Friday
Nov 27th
1835

Commences with the same kind of weather. At 12 o'clock and 30 minutes were up and headed to the N.E. continue boiling. One watch below middle part fine weather. Sunlight boiling latter part the same. So ends this 24 hours. Latitude 36° 12' S Long 15° 00' E

Saturday
Nov 28th
1835

Cruising For Whale

This 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from S. Steered N.W. at 3 pm. Saw a hump and a number of whales. At 4 pm made preparations for stowing down middle and latter part fine weather all hands employed. In stowing down saw a seal. This 24 hours. If ship about 5 miles off. So ends Latitude 36° 8' S Long East 14° 02'

Sunday
Nov 29th
1835

Commences with fine weather except heavy light winds from W. Steered W at 4 pm. Sunlight stowing down. At 6 pm saw 3 ships to leeward. All the middle and latter parts fine weather. So ends Latitude 36° 40' S Long 14° 10' E

Monday
Nov 30th
1835



This 24 hours commenced with calm. But thick hazy weather. Saw a whale. Land but he perceived the ship. And went off to the windward and quick. All the middle and latter parts strong winds. Saw no sight but. Trunk backs so ends this 24 hours. Latitude 36° 30' S

Tuesday
Dec 1st
1835



Commences with strong Gales and squally steered to the N. Steered very remarkable. The first part middle part fine weather at 8 am saw a whale. Board and struck he ran. Had to windward to cut. Nothing more. So ends Latitude 36° 18' S Long 12° 50' E

Wednesday
Dec 2nd
1835



This 24 hours commences with strong breezes from S. Steered W. Steered at 3 pm saw whales going quick. Land the boat out to no success. Middle and latter part fine weather. Saw hump backs. Land but. Not catch them. Nothing more. So ends this 24 hours. Latitude 36° 08' S Longitude 12° 50' E
