Cruising for Whales

This 24 hours commences with strong winds from NW stear W at 4 pm saw whales heard 2 boats on boat struck iron. Drove out. Came on train shortened sail and steared to the SE middle part lashed to the SW at 8 pm saw whales heard but to no success. So ends this 24th Lat^{td} 37°18' S Long 10°25' E

This 24 hours commences with fine rather gentle breeze from SE at 6 pm raised ship and headed to the ENE did not reflect the middle and latter parts fine weather saw whales heard but to no success. So ends this 24th Lat^{td} 37°00' S Long 10°50' E

Commences with fine rather gentle breezes from SE stear ESE at 4 pm saw the same whales again heard but the same luck at 7 pm a flock of land birds lit upon our riggs. caught 2 middle and latter parts fine weather saw 1 seal so ends Lat^{td} 37°33' S Longitude 10°55' E

Commences with fine rather and gentle breeze from WNW stear NW upon the star tack at 7 pm shortened sail as usual all the middle and latter parts fine weather saw 1 seal so ends Lat^{td} 37°44' S Longitude 10°40' E

Commences with fine rather clear to the E. at 4 pm saw 1 seal at 8 pm spoke the *Adelta* of Greenport was calling she had 5 whales and 130 sperm. Middle and latter parts strong gales saw a merchant part and one whale going to windward. Nothing more. So ends this 24th Lat^{td} 37°57' S Long 10°17' E

Cruising for Whales

This 24 hours commences with strong gales from NW stear NW under 2 high tops. At 8 pm saw a duck transport at 7 pm steared to the SE at 5 pm saw a number of whales but did not hear latter part fine weather but calm saw whales heard but to no success. So ends this 24th Lat^{td} 37°17' S Long 10°50' E

This 24 hours commences with calm and light airs at 4 pm light breeze from NE and a dry swell at the middle and latter parts fine weather saw whales heard one boat to. No success. So ends this 24th Lat^{td} 37°17' S Long 10°10' E

Commences with fine rather gentle breezes from the NW stear to the NE at 4 pm saw a merchant man standing to the E all the middle and latter parts strong winds. So ends this 24 hours Lat^{td} 37°57' S Longitude 10°00' E

Commences with strong gales from the NW stear NW at 4 pm thick haze rather 8° C at the middle part fine weather latter part a gale so ends saw 1 whale. Latitude 37°15' S Longitude 8°20' E

This 24 hours commences with a gale from the N stear to the West at 2 pm took in gill and mainsail at 9 pm took in fore and Miz topsail and headed to the E middle part the same latter parts moderate a great Mortall among the floggs all the big ones died nothing more of any consequence. So ends this 24 hours Latitude 38°15' S Long 7°18' E
