Thursday
Decemr the
24th 1835

This 24 hours commenced with gentle
breeze from N.W. stear S.W. under
All sail hands employed in handling
Bore at 7 pm possible kept the topsails
middle and latter parts strong gales
At 11 took in fore and mid-top
Tossail strong gales from the N.W.
so ends latt 33.55 S Longitude 71.28

Friday
Decemr the
25th 1835

This 24 hours commenced with strong
gales from N.W. with the shores at 2 pm
Moderated but the forecast by sea going
A strong sea of consequence middle
and latter parts strong gales from
N.W. still lay to headed to the
S.W. so ends this 24 hours latt 37.36 S
Long 61.42 E

Saturday
Decemr the
26th 1835

Commenced with same kind of wether
lay to headed to the S.W. nothing
Mer of any consequence the first part
middle parts strong winds latter
parts more moderate made sail at
12. He began again to blow strong
heavy of any consequence so ends this
24 hours latt 38.4 S Long 61.28 E

Sunday
Decemr the
27th 1835

Cruising For Whales

This 24 hours commenced with strong
gales from N.W. with haze clear
at 4 pm saw a right whale
and a number of fishbacks came to
windward sail and spoke the
George porter with 7 whales 3/4
at 7 pm sailed fore and mid topsails
at the middle and latter parts strong
breeze and heavy so saw 2 more sail
nothing more so ends latt 38.15 S
Long 61.5

Monday
Decemr the
28th 1835

This 24 hours commenced with strong
gale from N.W. stear to the S.W. at
2 pm more moderate tacked and steer
to the N at 7 pm became almost calm
shorted sail and stood to the N
All the middle and latter parts
strong gales at 10 am took in fore
and mid topsails and lay to latt 38.55 S
Long 61.35 E

Tuesday
Decemr the
29th 1835

Commenced with strong gales from
N.W. lay to headed to the S.W.
middle part continued the same at
7 am took the topsails and were
round and headed to the N.W. windward
At 10 am began to blow hard again
Took in the topsail at 11 am the forepart
so ends latt 39.4 S Longitude 61.7 E

Wednesday
Decemr the
30th

This 24 hours commenced with heavy
gales from W. southerly and strong
by sea at 6 pm took the star waste
in the upper courses at 8 continued
strong all the middle and latter parts
at 2 set the topsails took left so ends latt 39.25 S
Long 61.22 E

Thursday
Decemr the
31st 1835

Commenced with strong gales from N. headed
to N.W. at 2 pm more moderate at 8 pm
winded ship and headed to the N with the
middle and latter parts strong and
with topsails so ends latt 38.4 S
Long 61.18 E
