Thursday
January
21st
1836

Commences with strong gales
from WNW star N. westerly upon
The lar tack at 1 pm moderated
Sun set 4th of main Coors wind here
more to the W at 7 pm tacked to the
SW and at half past 11 pm tacked back
to the N. all the latter parts strong gale
so ends Latitude 40° 35' S Longitude 9° 12'

Friday
January
22nd
1836

This 24 hours commences with a Gale
from N. N. W. star W upon the
Star tack at 8 pm increased. Close
Reef the fore topsail and took in
The main at 7 pm took in the
Topsails and laid the ship to all
The middle part strong gales with
Rain at 10 am moderated sun
Wore ship headed to N. made sail
Latitude 41° 00' S Longitude 9° 25' W

Saturday
January
23rd
1836
Eliza Ann
Swain

Commences with strong gales from
WNW star to the N. under Double
Left topsail strong by sea running
at 7 pm gale increased took in the
Topsail and laid the ship to blowing
Hard all the middle part latter
Hauled to the SW and moderated
at 11 am off the topsails Close reef
Coors NW by N parted our main
Stay hand employed in fixing it
Saw large quantities of Calp And
A great number of birds Nothing
more so ends Lat 40° 20' S Long 8° 38' W

Sunday
January
24th
1836

Bound to the trustees

Commences with strong winds
And a by sea from SW star
NW by N under Close reef Topsail
And all wind on main and hand
Employed in Ships duty middle
Parts fine moderate weather made
All sail weather continued fine all
The latter parts with light breeze
so ends Latitude 39° 24' South Long 9° 15' W

Monday
January
25th
1836

This 24 hours commences with light
Air from NW star N. N. E. upon
The Starboard tack at 1 pm wind
increased a little all the middle and
latter strong gales with rain at
Inferior all nothing more so ends
Latitude 39° 45' South Long 10° 35' 15'

Tuesday
January
26th
1836

This 24 hours commences with
Strong gales from W star SW by
N upon the Starboard tack under
Close reef topsails & coors at 4 pm
bored ship and headed to the N. N. W.
middle and latter part Calms & light
Air from N. N. E. so ends this 24 hours
Latitude 39° 20' S Longitude 11° 4'

Wednesday
January
27th
1836

This 24 hours commences with light
Air from N. N. E. & accompanied with
Rain coors N. N. E. very by small force
The hand employed in Ships duty
All the middle parts strong gales at
at 8 am came on so severe that we
took in the topsails at 11 pm set them
Again so ends Lat 39° 45' S Long 12° 03' W

Thursday
January
28th
1836

Commences with changeable weather
from moderate & sunshine to a gale with
Rain at 2 pm wind hauled to W bored ship and
headed to the N. westerly all the middle and latter
Parts tolerable good weather with wind from
so ends Lat 39° 25' S Long 12° 23' W
