Commences with fine weather and
strong breeze from West course
S.E. & hands employed in ships duty
Duty all the middle and latter
parts fine weather and gentle breeze
from S.W. nothing more so ends
Latitude 36° 17' S Longitude 5° 20' W

Saturday
February the
6th 1836

This 24 hours commences with fine
weather and gentle breeze from S.W.
Course S.E. & hands employed in ships
duty all the middle and latter
parts fine weather and ends this 24 hours
Latitude 36° 45' S Longitude 4° 15' W

Sunday
February the
7th 1836

This 24 hours commences with fine
weather and gentle breeze from W.
Course S.E. at 2 pm violent storm
began and continued the spanner all the
middle parts fine weather latter
part wind to the N. accompanied
with rain nothing more so ends
Latitude 37° 55' S Longitude 1° 22' W

Monday
February
the 8th
1836

Commences with thick rainy weather
with fine breeze from S.E. course S.E.
middle part wind, hauled close to W.
latter part same kind of weather & ends
Latitude 38° 25' S Longitude 1° 45' E

Tuesday
February
the 9th 1836

Commences with gentle breeze from N.
Course S.E. with thick haze weather
all the middle and latter parts the
same & ends Latitude 39° 15' S Longitude 3° 52' E

Wednesday
February
the 10th
1836

Bound to the Cape

This 24 hours commences with
moderate breeze from S.W. with
thick hazy rainy weather all the
middle and latter part the same
& ends this day Latitude 39° 52' S Longitude 8° 00'

Thursday
February the
11th 1836

Commences with moderate weather
and light winds from S.E. course S.E.
hands employed in ships duty
at 4 pm became almost calm
middle part wind hauled to the S.W.
tacked and stood to the S.E. by S all
the latter parts light winds and
thick weather & ends saw several fin
backs Latitude 39° 54' S Longitude 8° 22' E

Friday
February the
12th 1836

Commences with thick foggy weather
moderate breeze from S.E. & S.
steer to the S.E. by S. upon the far tack
hands employed in making spring
at 3 pm wind hauled to the S.W. by S
on haze at 4 am got round to the
The S.W. became clear in the evening
more so ends Latitude 39° 51' S Longitude 11° 26'

Saturday
February the
13th 1836

Commences with fine weather from
N.W. & W. at 2 pm wind became
light nothing seen from the main
head of any consequence at 1 pm wind
hauled to the S.W. and all the latter
parts blew strong breeze & ends this 24
hours Latitude 39° 40' S Longitude 15° 2' E

Sunday
February the
14th
1836

This 24 hours commences with tolerable
good weather with strong breeze from
N.W. course S.E. at 1 pm look out for
got up water middle part wind hauled
to the S.W. and blew strong Gale at
8 am took in the main & fore sail
at noon set it again. Gale continues
strong with a heavy sea and this day
ends by observation Latitude 39° 50' S Longitude 16° 45' E
