February
15th
1836

Bound to Madagascar

This 24 hours commences with strong
Gales from the S.W. with a heavy S.E.
Breeze & S.D. running with the main
Topsailsail out at the middle and
latter parts the same so ends this
24 hours Lat^t 38° 23' S Long^{tude} 23° 00'

Tuesday
February
16th
1836

This 24 hours commences with gentle
Breezes from W.S.W. corner S.D. & covered
cragle sea on running with all sail.
Set saw number of fin backs hands
Employed in ships duty all the
middle and latter parts moderate
Breezes from W. with thick cloudy sea
last 24 hours experienced a strong
current from S.D. nothing over so
Ends Lat^t 38° 28' S Long^{tude} 20° 16'

Wednesday
February
17th
1836

Commences with strong winds and
squalls from S. corner S.D. At 1 pm
diminished building a potatoe bank
on deck and laid it put in 50 bushels
& c. all the middle and latter
parts strong breezes from S.D. to
Ends this 24 hours Lat^t 37° 25' S Long^{tude} 22° 20'

Thursday
February
18th
1836

This 24 hours commences with strong
Breezes from S.D. and fine weather
Steer S.N.E. upon the Star tack
Hands employed in ships duty middle
part wind hauled round to the E.
Covered ship and stood to the S by E at
7 pm saw breaches to the N.E. work
And had for them but saw no more of
them tackt back to the S.N. thing
More so ends Lat^t 38° 17' S Long^{tude} 21° 46'

Friday
February
19th
1836

This 24 hours commences with strong Gales
from the E. steer S.D. upon star tack
Under Down topsails saw 2 or 3 whales & watch
for look in S.D. & mainsail latter part them
ends Lat^t 39° 23' S Long^{tude} 22° 45'

Saturday
February
20th
1836

This 24 hours commences with strong
Breezes from E. northward steer S.D. &
Upon the Star tack under Last reef
Topsails and courses very bad sea
middle part more moderate made
Fair latter part fine weather made
All sail so ends Lat^t 39° 55' S Long^{tude} 23° 00'

Sunday
February
21st
1836

Commences with moderate breezes
& pleasant weather wind from N.E. &
Course S.D. & hands employed in ships
Duty all the middle and latter part
moderate breezes & baffling from
N.D. to N. with warm weather so ends
Lat^t 40° 8' S Long^{tude} 25° 00' East

Monday
February
22nd
1836

Commences with unsettled weather
Moderate breezes from N.D. to S. corner
& S. showers of rain at intervals
all the middle part same kind of
weather latter part strong Gale from
E. Doubt next the topsails and took in
the gale and mainsail S. This 24
Lat^t 40° 58' S Long^{tude} 28° 15' E

Tuesday
February
23rd
1836

Commences with a Gale from E.
And heavy weather steer to the S.D. &
Under Last topsails At 1 pm saw a ship
to the westward of us at 4 pm she
was off the Lee Beam about 3 miles
Steering along with us All night
A heavy tempest wind veered at the time
to the N.E. latter part more moderate
through the night lay to latter part
made All sail so ends Lat^t 41° 30' S Long^{tude} 29° 20'

Wednesday
February
24th
1836

Commences with unsettled weather and light
Breeze from S.D. & S. D. & S. D. & S. D.
And water quite green middle and latter
parts fine weather wind from S. at 10 am
Commenced breaking out in water so
Ends Lat^t 40° 31' S Long^{tude} 32° 00' S
