March 5th
1836

Bound to Madagascar

Commences with calm and fine weather hands employed in ship's duty. Weather uncomfortable warm. At the middle and latter part same kind of weather. Nothing more so ends. Lat by observation 23° 25' S Long 41° 55' E

Sunday
March 6th
1836

This 24 hours commences with light breeze from SW and fine weather. Hands employed in ship's duty. At 4 pm had quite a breeze all the middle and latter parts gentle breeze and smooth sea ends latitude 4° 15' N. Longitude 23° 25' S Long 42° 15' E

Monday
March 7th
1836

Commences with gentle breeze from SW and fine weather. Hands employed in ship's duty. At 4 pm had quite a breeze all the middle and latter parts gentle breeze and smooth sea ends latitude 4° 15' N. Longitude 23° 25' S Long 42° 15' E

Distant 10th

Tuesday
March 8th
1836

Commenced with same kind of wind and weather. At 2 pm made out for Brazil. At 4 pm had the Chances or chains running. The West side of Madagascar middle part strong breeze at 10 am in to Augustine Bay and come to anchor in 5th latitude weather Gold hunted by this. Cape coffee 3 months out 70 lbs

Wednesday
March 9th
1836

Commences with strong sea breeze all hands employed in trade. Weather disagreeable all the middle and latter parts strong sea and land breeze. All hands employed in trading. Ends this 24 hrs

Thursday
March 10th
1836

Left Madagascar

This 24 hours commences with fine weather one vessel of shore. And the rest employed plenty. Occurrences on board. I shall not note the transactions while we lay here nothing more untill our departure so ends this 24th

Thursday
March 11th
1836

This 24 hours commences with moderate gales from SW steam. At 4 pm in company with the Gold hunter with the ship together left a ship the harbor. And changed cap masher. At 2 pm saw Isaac. To the westward of us standing to the S at 4 pm the Gold hunter took and stood to the NW weather moderate and warm all the middle part fine weather latter part strong gales from SW nothing in sight. So ends lat 25° 00' S Long 42° 50' E

Friday
March 18th
1836

This 24 hours commences with strong gales from SW steam. At 4 pm the bar took at 2 pm dark reef. The topsails at 4 pm blew it strong. Gale at 8 took in the topsails. All the middle part continued the same latter part more moderate. Made sail set up the main rigging. Saw 2 sails to the S of us to end. Lat 26° 28' S Longitude 41° 55' E

Saturday
March 19th
1836

This 24 hours commences with strong gales from SW steam. At 4 pm the bar took hands employed in setting up fore rigging. All the middle and latter part strong winds so ends. Lat 27° 20' S Longitude 41° 48' E
