Tuesday
June the
14th
1836
Commenced with fine weather. Hunt
down whales along side and cut them
In. At 12 past 8 o'clock the watch
Weather continued fine & middle
Part cleared the barrels. Latter part Boiled
St. Pau. & sail to the west of us. Ends
Lat 27° 25' S Longitude 37° 20' E.

Wednesday
June the
15th
1836
This 24 hours commences with calms
and light airs from the N. & steam to the
N. & E. began boiling. Saddle still
In sight. All the middle and latter
Parts fine weather. Finest Boiling
At 4 Am turned up 24 lbs. S. ends
This 24 hours Lat 27° 5' S Longitude 37° 10' E.

Thursday
June the
16th
1836
Commences with gentle breeze from E.
Then N. & E. saw a great number of
Hump and Finbacks. Nothing more in
sight all the middle and latter parts
Fine weather. Employed in minding
The Star quarter boat. Ends the 24 hours
Latitude 26° 1' S

Friday
June the
17th
1836
Commences with gentle breezes from
S. & E. steam to the N. & E. under all sail
Hunt employed in ships. At 8 A.M.
Middle and latter parts fine
Weather. Saw a number of hump
Backs. Ends this 24 hours
Latitude 25° 42' S Longitude 38° 30' E.

Saturday
June the
18th
1836
Commences with gentle breezes from
N. & E. steam to the N. & E. upon a wind
At 2 pm. Saw more hump back land
boat to go success. All the middle
Parts strong gales from the N. & E.
light till 6 in the morning. Then
sailed tow upon the star tack
At 8 Am. Saw 5 sails. Am standing
N. & E. and down to the E. & S. ends
Lat 25° 34' S Longitude 36° 20' E.

Margaret Cruising In Mozambique Channel

Sunday
June the
19th
1836
Commences with strong gales from the
N. & E. steam to the N. & E. under all sail
Heavy sea on the 1 pm. Bored ship and
turned to the N. & E. no ships in sight
At 3 pm. took in the 1. and
1/2 top sail and lay to till the mid.
And latter parts strong gales. Ends
Lat 24° 25' S Longitude 38° 30' E.

Monday
June the
20th
1836
This 24 hours more moderate
Trade sale and stood to the S. W.
Flew on on middle part calm. Latter
Parts light wind. Took out the after hole
And stowed 30 lbs of oil. Nothing more so
Ends this 24 hours Lat 25° 52' S Longitude 38° 52' E.

Tuesday
June the
21st
1836
Commences with fine weather. Gentle breeze
from the E. at 1 pm. Tackled and
stood to the S. & E. hands employed
In stowing the after hole. At 4 pm.
Dismissed weather continued fine. Saw
Nothing of any consequence. Middle and
latter part fine weather. Tiller the Pan
Saw 2 ships. Gold hunter Lord. And mouth
And the ship's named with the Gold. Ends
Lat 26° 53' S Longitude 38° 27' E.

Wednesday
June the
22nd
1836
Commences with fine weather and gentle
breeze from the E. & E. steam to the
S. & E. at 4 pm. 3/4 coffin went on board
Weather continues fine. D. C. & C.
Middle part tackled to the N. & E. at 3
& And tackled. And stood to the S. & E.
In sight. Ends Lat 27° 07' S Longitude 38° 47' E.

Thursday
June the
23rd
1836
Commences with fine weather. Gentle
breeze from the S. & E. steam to the S. in Comp.
With the 1 hunter. Hands employed in
Minding. At 8 pm. spoke the Gold. And
P. Chase 6 months out. No sail. He came in
Board. All the middle and latter fine
Weather. Ends Lat 27° 10' S Longitude 38° 15' E.
