August
16th
1836

Commences with fine weather
and light breeze from E southerly steer
to the S under all sail hand employ'd
In ships duty we sail in sight to the
south of the middle and latter
Part calm to end latt 25° 31' S
Longitude 40° 57' E

Friday
Saturday
August
17th
1836

Commences with calm and light
breeze hands employ'd in ships duty
At 4 pm continued the same I am
of weather I sail steer in lat 23°
All the middle part calm at 1 am
lost light breeze from the E steer
by E nothing so end latt 26° 7' S

Sunday
August
18th
1836

Commences with fine weather & gentle
breezes from E cross by E spoke
The heliogram up spirits gam'd with
The hands employ'd in ships duty
All the middle and latter part fine
breezes from N to end latt 27° 15' S
Longitude 41° 20' E

Monday
August
19th
1836

Commences with strong breeze from S
Cross & gaining with paladium at 4 pm
Wind haul'd to the NW steer S by E
at 8 pm became almost calm at 4 am
Took a small from the S E All the
latter strong Gale from Westward
At 10 am took in fore and main topsails
to end latt 28° 20' S Longitude 41° 56' E

Tuesday
August
20th
1836

Commences with strong Gales from
S at 1 pm were bound and steer
to the NW at 2 pm more moderate
but such squally weather All the
middle and latter part the same
Nothing at 4 pm off
The latitude
28° 37' S

Bound to the South

Wednesday
August
10th
1836

Commences with strong winds from
the S E headed to the S W under
Doubt reef topsails at 4 pm
Boats & c Saw a number of fish
all the middle part fine breeze
from the S E cross S W latter part
more moderate wind bafflin to end
latt at hours latt 29° 30' S Longitude 41° 00'

Thursday
August
11th
1836

Commences with unsettled weather
light & bafflin hands employ'd in
ships duty at 8 pm middle and latter
part Breeze wind from N E cross
S W to end latt 31° 32' S Longitude 40° 22'

Friday
August
12th
1836

Commences with the same kind
of weather hands employ'd in ships
duty at 2 pm took aboard wind from
N E at 8 pm sail with the topail
and at 5 pm took in fore and main
and lay to saw a ship lying to
Near us to end this 24 hours latt 33° 33'

Saturday
August
13th
1836

Commences with strong Gale from
the N laying to headed to the
N E under main topail and fore
a ship about 8 miles to the seaward
latter tow All the middle and latter
part light winds and calms ship in sight
to end latt 34° 15' S Longitude 42° 12'

Sunday
August
14th
1836

Commences with gentle breezes from S E
Cross S W at 4 pm spoke the Atlantic
off big port longitude lat. upper gam'd
at 8 pm became calm with a light
All the middle part light winds latter
part strong to end latt 35° 16' S

Monday
August
15th
1836

Fine weather gentle breeze from S E cross
at 2 pm became equal by took in fore and
at 7 pm took them again and kept on for
latter part strong Gale latt 36° 44' S Longitude 42° 12'
