Bound Home

At 1 pm took fine breeze from
N by W course S by W. At the fore
topmast standing said ship still in
sight of the white quarter showing the
same crew with us at 4 pm hauled up
another point - at 8 pm weather fine
continued all the latter 2 sails
in sight ships steering with us
to end with 27° 55' S Longitude 4° 12'

Tuesday
March the
7th
1827

Commenced with fine weather and
gentle breeze from SE course N by W
& ships in sight steering to N by W
hands employed in ships duty &c
At 2 pm spoke the whale ship Joseph
Maxwell Bound home on to St. Helena
Then home found ash went their way
Here at 6 pm parted the steering from
N by W we all the middle and
latter part strong breeze put 2 more
standing sails upon her to end
Latitude 28° 22' S Longitude 4° 56'

Wednesday
March the
8th
1827

Commenced with strong breeze from
SE course N by W hands employed in
ships duty &c all the middle and
latter parts the same kind of weather from
at sail steering to the N by W nothing
more to end with 22° 10' S Longitude 5° 08'

Thursday
March the
9th
1827

Commenced with fine weather & gentle
breeze from SE course N by W hands
employed in ships duty All the middle
and latter the same to end the red
ends with 21° 10' S Longitude 5° 10' W

Friday
March the
10th
1827

Commenced with gentle trades course
N by W hands employed in ships duty
Weather continued fine all the middle
and latter parts to end the red
ends with 20° 55' S Longitude 5° 22' W

1827

Commenced with fine weather and
gentle trades course N by W hands
employed in ships duty &c
Weather continued fine and fair all
the middle and latter parts to end
Latitude 18° 52' S Longitude 4° 25'

Sunday
March the
12th
1827

Commenced with fine weather and
gentle trades hands employed in ships
duty Middle and latter the same
at 8 pm topmast standing said
to end with 17° 55' S Longitude 5° 25'

Monday
March the
13th
1827

Wind in weather the same course
N by W All the middle parts fine weather
At 8 am saw the island of St.
Helena bearing N by E distant from
10 to 12 leagues weather continued fine
to end with 15° 45' S Longitude 6° 52'

Tuesday
March the
14th
1827-17

Commenced with fine weather & gentle
breeze from SE course N by W hands
employed in fitting rigging At 4
pm St. Helena was just in sight
bearing SE all the middle and
latter parts fine weather to end
with 14° 15' S Longitude 8° 15'

Wednesday
March the
15th
1827-18

Commenced with fine weather gentle
trades hands employed in ships duty
All the middle and latter parts fine
Weather saw an English bark steering
the same course with us to end the
Latitude 12° 55' S Longitude 10° 10'

Thursday
March the
16th
1827-19

Commenced with fine weather & gentle
trades course N by W hands employed
in ships duty All the middle and
latter parts fine weather At 10 am
saw St. Helena bearing N by E
the quarter to end the red
ends with 11° 15' S Longitude 11° 5'
