2 points above the water weather
All the middle and latter parts fine
Weather At 10 am the stranger sail
was 1/2 beam off us about 1/4 p.m. &
sheared to sea in English East India Co
A barque to end lat 9° 45' S long 15° 15' W

March the
18th 1837
4th

Commences with fine weather fine
trades hands employ'd in getting up
Rigging At 4 p.m. our comrade bore
2 points forward of our beam with
landmark's left side. Royal studs to
all the middle and latter parts fine
Weather At 10 am the island of
Ascension bearing N.W. by N. 1/2 N. dis
30 miles our comrade still in sight
To end lat 8° 25' S long 14° 10' W

Sunday
March the
19th 1837
22th out

Commences with light trades course
N.W. by W. hands employ'd in getting rigging
Our comrade is in sight yet
All the middle and latter parts fine
Weather At 10 p.m. past the island
About 10 miles from the shore to the
W. Nothing more to end lat 7° 33' S
long 15° 53' W

20th 1837
23th

Commences with fine weather
Gentle trades course S.W. by W. all the
middle and latter parts fine
To end lat 6° 15' S long 16° 05' W

Tuesday
March the
21st 1837
24th

Commences with fine weather and
pleasant weather hands employ'd in
Duty &c middle and latter parts
Breves with rain off water
Nothing more to end lat 4° 52' S
long 17° 50' W

March the
22nd 1837
25th

Bound Home

Commences with strong breezes
from the S.E. course S.W. by S
Hands employ'd in ship duty
Rattling the rigging &c Middle
latter parts fine weather to end
lat 2° 52' S long 20° 07' W

Thursday
March the
23rd 1837
26th

Commences with fine weather &
gentle trades course S.W. by S
Employ'd in ship duty rattling
Rigging &c all the middle and
latter parts fine weather saw 2 sail
one English barque passed lat
2° 45' S nothing more to end this
lat 2° 46' S long 23° 14' W

Friday
March the
24th 1837
27th

Commences with moderate breeze
and gentle trades hands employ'd
in ship duty &c middle and
latter the same to end this 24 hours
lat 1° 44' S long 24° 33' W

Saturday
March the
25th 1837
28th

Commences with light trades
course S.W. running with steady
breeze to S.W. hands employ'd in
ship duty &c all the middle and
latter parts fine weather nothing
more to end this 24 hours
lat 1° 45' S long 25° 58' W

Sunday
March the
26th 1837
29th

Commences with gentle trades and
fine weather course S.W. by W. hands employ'd
in getting rigging &c all the
middle and latter parts fine weather
to end this 24 hours lat 20 miles S long 26° 05'

Monday
March the
27th 1837
30th

Commences with fine weather and gentle breeze
from S.E. course S.W. by W. all the middle
part fine weather and light wind At 7 am
made the island of St. Paul sight ahead run
within 1/2 ship length at 10 am it was
lost of sight at 10 am to end
lat 2° 58' S long 29° 20' W
