Commenced with strong trades
Crews of 10 hands employed in
Ship, Duty &c At 2 pm Saw
a light to the E of us steering to
the W Pass, within quarter of a
mile of us showed English collars
All the middle and latter parts
Equally with 20 and lat 15° 20' N
Long 49° 45' W

Monday
April 10th
1827
44

Commenced with strong trades
From N & E course N & W running
At 11 am fore & main topmast standing
Drops out Saw a large quantity
of gull weed to windward of us
Lat 17° 28' N Long 51° 15' W

Tuesday
April 11th
1827
45

Commenced with light winds
& trades Crews of 10 hands
employed in painting the tops of
fore mast &c All the middle
and latter parts moderate weather
Commenced painting the out side of
the ship &c part of great quantity
of gull weed 11 am a man fell
over board stage lashing fore way
board of boat and picked him up
Lat 18° 24' N Long 52° 34' W

Wednesday
April 12th
1827
46

Commenced with moderate west
and gentle breezes from E course N & W
Hands employed in painting ship's
Stern Saw a sail off the lar bow
at 8 pm a square top was passed us steer-
ing to the W All the middle and
latter parts light wind and
Saw a lat 20° 4' N Long 53° 15' W

Thursday
April 13th
1827
47

Commenced with light winds from SW
at 10 am large quantities of gull weed in
sight &c All the middle and
latter parts light wind and calm
to wind latitude 20° 32' N

April 14th
1827
48

Bound Home

Commenced with calms and light
breezes from N & W hands employed
At 2 pm took a breeze from N & E
All the middle and latter parts fine
breeze from N & E course N & W
At 6 pm showed headed the bar
George's hour 14 days from Portland
Lat same papers Nothing more to and
latitude 21° 24' N longitude 53° 45' W

Saturday
April 15th
1827
49

Commenced with fine breezes from
N & E course N & W at 11 am the
head to the E kept N & E and E
The studding sails & all the middle
and latter parts fine weather to wind
latitude 23° 32' N longitude 55° 37' W

Sunday
April 16th
1827
50

Commenced with fine weather and
gentle breezes from E course N & W
Hands employed at 1 pm Saw a sail
off the stern bow All the middle and
latter parts fine weather to wind
in a shewer passed us steering N & W
to wind lat 25° 33' N Long 57° 20' W

Monday
April 17th
1827
51

Commenced with fine weather and
gentle breezes from E course N & W
Large quantities of gull weed in
sight &c All the middle and latter
parts fine weather and winds to wind
latitude 27° 22' N longitude 58° 43' W

Tuesday
April 18th
1827
52

Commenced with fine weather and
gentle breezes from S & E course
N & W hands employed in cleaning
New Remains Topping All the middle
and latter parts fine weather
at 11 am Saw a ship bound to the N & E
showed English collars Nothing
more to wind lat 29° 12' N Long 60° 30' W
