

Friday July 7<sup>th</sup> Lat  $33^{\circ}$  Long  $48^{\circ}$

This day comes with good breeze from W.S.W. Schooner running under all sail. The latter part weather the same. Latter part wind getting quite fresh and coming from the same quarter.

Saturday July 8<sup>th</sup> Lat  $33^{\circ} 3'$  Long  $48^{\circ} 30'$

This day comes with fresh S.W. wind. Spiddle and latter part blowing fresh gale from same quarter and plenty of rain. One whale in sight.

Sunday July 9 Lat  $32^{\circ} 58'$  Long  $48^{\circ} 49'$

This day comes with better weather and wind very light from N.W. but still a very heavy running from the Westward. One whaling schooner in sight. Spiddle and latter part calm.

Monday July 10<sup>th</sup> Lat  $33^{\circ} 30'$  Long  $48^{\circ} 49\frac{1}{2}'$

This day comes with calm. Examined the Ocho Varella Capt came aboard of us. Spiddle part calm. Latter part got a light breeze from N.E.W. All sail set cruising. Ends with two whaling schooners in sight.

Tuesday July 11<sup>th</sup> Lat  $33^{\circ} 26'$  Long  $48^{\circ} 55'$

This day comes with good breeze from N.W. All sail set standing into the North. At 5:45 raised a lone whale going quick into the W.S.W. did not lower for him as it was too late. At dark stood in the mainail and stood into the Westward. Two whaling schooners in sight.

Wednesday July 12<sup>th</sup>

Middle part very light wind from N.W. Latter part weather about the same at 6:10 A.M. Raised a large whitewater shortly afterwards raised spouts turned out to be two large whales acting very queer. Lowered the boats down and 2nd & 3rd mates both darted but the whales would not let them get near enough. Ends with the boats chasing. Three whaling schooners in sight chasing.

Wednesday July 12<sup>th</sup> Lat  $33^{\circ}$  Long  $49^{\circ}$

This day comes with pleasant weather and good breeze from N.W. At 2 P.M. whaler started off into the eastward and soon after met a school of whales coming from the San Pedro (Varella) and at 2:30 P.M. third mate got fast to a bull whale and got shore by a loose whale soon after the mate got fast and at 2:50 had the whale dead. At 4 P.M. got him alongside and got dinner and at 6 P.M. started cutting and at 8 P.M. got the head off and some of the body skinned in left the rest until the morning. At day light commenced cutting again and at 10 A.M. finished cutting. Unrope the gear and commenced boiling. Ends with four whales in sight but boiling.

Thursday July 13<sup>th</sup> Lat  $33^{\circ}$  Long  $49^{\circ}$

This day comes with very moderate weather and light wind from N.W. four whales in sight boiling. Spiddle and latter parts flat calm.
