Wednesday the 30

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from S.E. & stirring S.E. by E. the middle part much the same at 7 P.M. Calm and at 8 lowered a boat & catch a few fish the latter part - Calm & ends the day

These 24 hours begins with light air from W. W. stirring S.E. by S. & saw a ship stirring across the horizon the middle part fresh breezes from S.E. & shortened sail at 10 P.M. were ship heading S.W. & at 6 P.M. saw a sail of our size the day ends with fresh breezes

These 24 hours continues with fresh breezes from S.E. and at 2 P.M. took ship heading S. by W. at 5 reef topsails & took in the main sail & fore sail & at 8 P.M. set them again and at 9 took them in at 8 took in the fore topsail & so ends the day with strong gale from S.E. & S.

These 24 hours continues with strong gale from the S.E. & have to under 2 reef at 3 P.M. & fore sail & at 7 P.M. reef the fore sail & main topsail at 10 took in the fore sail & at 11 blowing very hard at 7 P.M. set the fore sail at 9 took it in & ends the day with 24 hours Lat 40° 55' North

These 24 hours begins with strong gale from S.E. heading with the south at 8 squalls of rain at 5 and the fore sail & were ship heading S. by E. the middle part squally and at the fore sail & fore sail & at 11 P.M. saw black fish & lowered got one & took him in & ends the day

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from south and employed a chasing away, & black fish stirring S.E. & the middle part strong breezes & reef the topsails the latter part much the same & saw a Brig stirring

These 24 hours begins with fresh gale from W. & W. stirring S.E. under 2 reef topsails at 7 P.M. took in the fore sail & left to the wind heading S. by W. the middle part heavy squalls from W. & the latter part strong breezes & saw a ship stirring S.W. & we employed in boiling a black fish, & stirring S.E. & so ends the day
