Saturday the 9

These 24 hours begins with Moderate breezes
and shifting to the S. E. at 2 P.M. sun of 2.
Spoke the Bark-like Boat of New Bedford
7 weeks but at 10 P.M. when we started at
7 took in topgallant sails the middle & latter
part Moderate so ends the day Lat 38° 10 North
Long 37° 56 West

Sunday the 10

These 24 hours begins with a Moderate breeze
from N. E. W. shifting to S. by E. at 7 P.M. took
in sail & hove to the wind at 5 P.M. Made all
sail heading South by the day ends Lat 37° 15.08
Long 38° 30 West

Monday the 11

These 24 hours begins with Moderate breezes from
S. E. shifting N. at 7 P.M. took in sail & hove
to the middle part moderate at 5 P.M. Made sail
at 8 ruff 3 sails with a strong breeze & shifting
by the wind at 9 took in the fore top sail & it being
very squally at 11 & it sail again & ends the day
Lat 37° 50 North

Tues the 12

These 24 hours begins with Moderate breezes from
N. E. shifting by the wind heading N. E. & showed
of rain at 7 P.M. took in sail and left too the
wind heading, N. E. at 5 P.M. Made sail & it
by the wind at 8 started & N. E. so ends the day
with moderate breezes Lat 38° 38.28
Long 38° 55 West

Wednesday the 13

These 24 hours begins with Moderate breezes
from the Westward shifting S. E. & employed in
ships duty at 7 P.M. took in sail & left
too heading S. at 5 P.M. Made sail & started
& at 10 left too heading S. E. W. so ends the
day Lat 37° 54 North
Long 37° 49 West

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Thursday the 14 of June

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from
N. E. shifting by the wind & at 4 P.M. saw
Black Bird covered got near & at 8 spoke
the gun of Fair Haven no sail & we started
sail at 5 P.M. Made sail & starting to the
Northward & the day end with a strong breeze
from N. E. on land the mainsail & bent it
again at 12 Lat 38° 00 North
Long 37° 52 West

Friday the 15

These 24 hours begins with fresh gale from
N. E. shifting to the South at 4 saw a Brig
a head and we took in the fore top sail at 8
took in the fore sail the middle part squally at
5 P.M. Made Moderate & made sail shifting S. E. E.
with breezes from North Lat 38° 06 North
Long 37° 18 West

Saturday the 16

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from
the North & shifting to the Southward far to
find whale at 7 P.M. took in sail & wore ship
& left too heading to the Eastward the middle
part fresh breezes & at 6 P.M. made sail shifting
S. E. E. so ends the day Lat 37° 58 North
Long

Sunday the 17

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from
the N. W. shifting S. E. W. at 5 P.M. wore
ship shifting S. E. E. the middle & latter
part fresh gale so ends the day Lat 37° 20
Long 34° 40 West

Monday the 18

These 24 hours begins with strong gale
from N. W. and shifting S. E. E. at 3 P.M.
put 2 ruff in the topsails at 6 squally &
have been squander close reef in topsail heading to
the South the latter part moderate & started S. E. E.
to the day end Lat 37° 44 North
Long 34° 00 West
