

Journal On Board Barque Maria New Bedford
 June the 19 of June

These 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from the North stirring E. N. E. under single reef topsails the middle part moderate & cloudy at 1 P.M. all left too and at day light kept of her course E. N. E. the latter part fresh breeze so wind Lat $38^{\circ} 55'$
 Long $32^{\circ} 10' 00''$

Wednesday the 20

These 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from the North stirring E. N. E. at 7 P.M. took in sail & left too to the south at 11 heavy gale & close reefed the mainsail & reefed the foresail the latter part the same so wind the day Lat $38^{\circ} 45'$
 Long $31^{\circ} 55' 00''$

Thursday the 21

These 24 hours begins with heavy gale from N. and lying sea the middle part the same the weather moderate at 5 P.M. & foggy at 9. Cleared up and made sail stirring 10 at 11 saw a ship ahead & so ends the day Lat
 Long $31^{\circ} 07' 00''$

Friday the 22

These 24 hours begins with fresh breeze at 1 P.M. some ship for fear of the land & stood to the south under short sail it being thick & calumtating the land close by at 5 P.M. made the land island of Flores carrying 1812 miles dist. & at 8 made Carve Baring 18. 20 miles dist. at 9 past 6 spoke the Brig Lorange of Rochester 7 weeks out 120 of Oct. 20 we stood off from the land the middle part steady gale from N. E. & have too under close reef mains topsails so the day ends making to the south Lat
 Long

Saturday the 23

These 24 hours begins with heavy gale & lying too heading to the S. W. at 4 the wind held N. E. & moderate & set the foresail the latter part calm and all sail out Flores & Carve Baring to the south Lat
 Long

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 June the 24

These 24 hours begins with calm weather & Flores & Carve in sight at 10 ship & Brig at 6 P.M. took in sail at 8 a light breeze from S. W. & stood N. E. at 11 have too at 4 P.M. made sail & stood in for the land to look for whales on the day ends Lat
 Long $34^{\circ} 07' 00''$

Sunday the 25

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from S. W. & close in to the land & stood off to the N. E. at 7 P.M. took in sail & left too heading S. E. the middle part thick & have too so ends the day Lat
 Long

Monday the 26

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from N. and foggy & have too heading Northward the middle part clear & at 4 P.M. made sail & at 8 fact ship & stood S. E. by S. & ends the day Lat $30^{\circ} 04' 00''$
 Long $30^{\circ} 35' 00''$

Tuesday the 27

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from N. E. by E. stirring S. E. by S. at 11 P.M. held up the mainsail & at 1 P.M. fact ship heading N. at 3 fact back again & at 4 P.M. Pico & St. George & Grassa Baring South E. by S. at 9 saw a ship & Brig & at 10 fact standing off from the land so ends the day Lat
 Long

Wednesday the 28

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from East at 1 P.M. fact ship and stood in for the land at 5 fact of 20 at 9 reefed the topsails and the middle & latter part light breeze from the south stirring to the eastward the day ends calm Lat
 No Whales to day
 On this last night
