 Thid the 29

These 24 hours begins with Calm weather & the
 Land in sight at 6. P.M. took in sail & at 5 P.M.
 Made sail again & at 10 lowered for Riddle instead
 of Black Tish at 11 came on Board and the day
 ends with Light air from N.W. Lat 39+24 S
 Long

Thid the 30

These 24 hours begins with Light air from N.W.
 & standing N.E. the Land ahead at 4 stood E.S.E.
 the wind N.W. & the middle part moderate and the
 latter part the same & steering to the N.W. & ends
 Lat 39=56 North
 Long 27=00 West

Thid the 1 of Aug

These 24 hours begins with Moderate Breezes
 from N.E. & standing N.W. the Land in sight
 at 5 saw a sail & at 7 shortened sail at 5 P.M.
 rained at 7 blew back and made all sail & stood
 at 10 saw Sparrow Whales & at 11 past Lownd
 But they were going to fast to windward at 12
 came on Board & with the day Lat 39+55 North
 Long 37+35 W

Thid the 2 of Aug

These 24 begins with Moderate Breezes from the
 N.E. & standing by the wind N.E. far to get up
 with the Whales of we came at 4 took ship & stood
 to the South the middle part Calm & so forth at
 5 P.M. Grassow in sight Baring South & the day
 ends with fine weather Lat 39+58 N
 Long 37+40 W

Thid the 3

These 24 hours begins with Moderate Breezes
 from N.W. & standing in for the Land at 7
 shortened sail the middle part rained at 8 P.M.
 Made sail & stood in by the wind at 10 light of
 South for Fiercia & at 11 past 10 saw a Brig ahead
 and so ends these 24 hours with fine Breeze Lat 39=20 N
 Long 37=15 W

 Thid July 31 These 24 hours begins with fine breeze
 from N.W. & standing in for the Land of
 Fiercia & at 8 P.M. spoke the Brig Dromo of
 Rantucket & White but 80 bbls of oil & saw a
 ship in shore at 7 shortened sail & stood of shore
 at 12 took ship & stood in, at 5 P.M. made sail
 & 7 ships & Brigs in sight at 10 spoke the
 Currier of New Bedford & with out no oil & so
 the day ends with fine weather Lat 39=07 S
 Long 27=00 W

Thid Aug 1 These 24 hours begins with fresh
 breezes from N.W. and standing in for the Land
 & a number of ships in sight the middle & latter
 part much the same & ends the day Lat 39+16 N
 Long 27+06 W

Thid Aug 2 These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes
 from N.W. & standing of shore to the North
 the middle & latter part much the same & the
 Islands in sight & the day ends Lat 39+45 N
 Long 27+19 W

Thid Aug 3 These 24 hours begins with fresh
 breezes from N.W. & in sight of the Whaler
 Bow & stood in at 5 stood of & shortened
 sail the middle & latter part fresh gale & standing
 in for the Land & so ends the day Lat
 Long

Thid Aug 4 These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes
 & in words Fiercia & at 2 spoke the Brig
 Dromo of Rantucket & the Capt came on Board
 at 7 left her & stood of to the S.E. at 10 wore
 ship & stood in at 5 P.M. heavy Squalls of the
 Land and took in the foretop sail and some top & saw
 a ship under key Lee the latter part the same
 & ends the day Lat
 Long
