 breezes from East turning to the South
 at 6 P.M. took in sail at 6 P.M.
 made sail headed to the North & saw
 2 vessels in sight and so the day
 ended with fresh breezes. Lat 17-19.2

 for whales the middle part fine weather
 and standing to the S. E. the latter part
 saw nothing of note Lat 17-20.2
 Long 58-54.2

Tues. Sept the 2 These 24 hours commenced with strong
 breezes from S. E. & boiling & looking
 for whales at 4 P.M. squalls of rain
 the middle & latter part fine. Lat 17-26.2
 Long 58-55.2
