

Remarks on board bark Maria of New Bedford

Saturday, July, the 17th 1862

First part fine Pleasant weather steering by the wind heading S.E. by E. with all sail on at Sunset very Pleasant working in to the East Middle & latter part very Pleasant saw many Porpoises & birds so much the Day

Lat. by obs 54° 08' North

Long by Chron 120° 16' 40" West

Sunday, July, the 20th

First part calm increased with very fine & pleasant weather steering by the wind heading S.E. by E. at 1/2 P.M. light squally at Sunset very squally took in our top Gallant sail at half past 11 P.M. set it again. Middle part fine light weather at Daylight & took ship to the South at 8 A.M. & took again to the S.E. saw Porpoises so much the Day

Long by Chron 119° 14' 20" West

Monday, July, the 21st

First part fine clear & pleasant at half past 8 P.M. squally took ship to the South at half past 11 P.M. took again to the S.E. some squally & wind at 5 P.M. took again to the South at Sunset took in all light sail took a rain squally Middle part squally at Daylight took a heavy squally & rain all latter part at 10 A.M. wore ship to the S.E. so much the Day

Tuesday, July, the 22nd 1862

First part heavy rain at 2 P.M. clear way the ship heading S.E. under half top sails for sail & main sail fell & sprain her at 4 P.M. very labouring fine breeze from S.E. steering by the wind heading from E. by S. to S.E. by E. at half past 11 P.M. set flying jib & main top Gallant sail. Middle part very Pleasant at Daylight set all sail at 9 A.M. some light squally saw nothing so much the Day

Longitude by Chron 116° 22' West

Wednesday, July, the 23rd

First part very Pleasant & light wind heading S.E. by E. with all sail on at Sunset very Pleasant steering by the wind Middle part very light air still heading S.E. by E. at 5 P.M. calm & squally fine Sperm for top Gallant mast bark stay still dead calm saw nothing so much the Day

Lat. by obs 50° 30' North

Longitude by Chron 118° 28' West

Thursday, July, the 24th

First part employed put up the fore top Gallant mast bark stay at 2 P.M. finish still dead calm at 4 P.M. took a light breeze from S.E. by E. steered S.E. with all sail on working in to the East Middle part very light air still steering S.E. at 7 A.M. employed get out the studding sails & studding sails with light air from the North saw nothing so much the Day
