

Remarks on board bark Alcona of New

Friday August the 29th 1862 led fort
First part fine pleasant breeze
from W the ship heading S.E. at sunset
the platensis land bearing North dist 15
miles at 8 pm. tacked of shore at 10 pm.
took in all light sails but main. Gaff gall
ant sail. The ship heading W by S at 3
Am. tacked in shore heading E.S.E. so much
the day. Settle by abt 11 15 South

Saturday August the 30th
First part heading in shore at
sunset the point st henela bearing South
dist 10 miles still heading in shore saw a
ship lay to and anchor off point st henela
& small sail get under way at 5 pm. tacked
of shore the ship heading W by N at 11
Am. tacked in shore at daylight the point
of st henela bearing E.S.E. dist 12 miles
at 10 am spoke one of the Edward Leary
boat the ship lay to anchor she got 18
Whals made gun to lile at Maridam.
the point of st henela bearing North dist
2 miles so ends the day

Sunday August the 31st
First part heading long by the land
heading S.E. by S the land at but 4 miles
of middle part the ship head S by E with
very light air at daylight the Muerta si land
in sight dist 12 miles bearing S.E. at
Maridam the Muerta si land bearing
N.P.E. dist 15 miles saw a ship to
Anchor at Muerta si land so much day
Settle by abt 21 South

in the Pacific ocean working up the coast of Peru

Monday September the 1st 1862
First part very light air from the
W the ship heading S.S.W. A large ship
in sight still on in shore tacked at sunset
the land at but 10 miles at 7 pm. tacked ship
of shore until 11 pm at 11th tacked in shore
latter part calm the ship head ~~W~~ very
still strong current to the South at 7 Am.
took a light breeze from the W.S. sails in
sight so ends the day
Settle by abt 30 59 South

Tuesday September the 2nd
First part fine breeze from the W the
the Cape Blanco bearing South dist 20 miles
at sunset took in all light sails at 6 pm.
tacked ship of shore the Cape Blanco bea-
ring S.E. dist 6 miles still working up to
pass to with strong S.W. current at 7
pm. double reefed for Gaff sails fresh
breeze from S.E. the ship heading S.W.
by S at 3 Am. wore ship on in shore
tacked at 7 Am. the Cape Blanco in sight
bearing N.P.E. dist 20 miles Cape Negro bearing
S.E. dist 15 miles at Maridam the Cape
Negro bearing East ~~10~~ and the day
Settle by abt 41 22 South

Wednesday September the 3rd
First part strong winds from
S.E. the ship heading East set flying Jole
& main Gaff Gallant sail at sunset the
Cape Negro bearing South dist 5 miles
middle & latter part very light breeze
at daylight point Negro bearing East so much
the day
