

Friday, November the 14th 1862
Remarks on Board the Bark Albatross W.B. Thompson Master

First part set whole main topsail heading to the S.E. at sunset set whole topsail Middle part strong winds the ship still heading to the S.E. at 8 A.M. tarred to the North at 9 A.M. tarred to the S.E. again saw many black fish at 11 A.M. saw at break to the wind so ends the Day
Lat by alt 8° 21' South
Long by Chron 130° 54' West

Saturday November the 15th

First part employed caulking the side at 2 P.M. tarred to the North still fresh breeze from the N.E. at sunset took in all light sails Middle part fresh breeze at daylight squally commenced studding down the side at 11 A.M. finished studding down studding about 2 o'clock so ends the Day
Lat by alt 9° 41' South
Long by Chron 131° 18' West

Sunday Nov the 16th

First part employed studding of fore and main ship to the S.E. saw a black fish to the wind at 2 P.M. tarred to the North but saw nothing more at 11 P.M. tarred to the S.E. Middle part fresh breeze took in all light sails latter part more moderate saw nothing the ship leaks the same saw streaks in 24 hours so ends the Day
Lat by alt 8° 56' South
Long by Chron 130° 18' West

Monday Nov the 17th 1862

First part fine moderate weather the ship heading from S.E. to S.E. by E with all sail set Middle part fresh winds from the N.E. took in all light sail still heading S.E. under whole topsails on 10 o'clock and the ship dandy the ship still leaks saw streaks in 24 hours the Day
Lat by alt 10° 09' South
Long by Chron 129° 05' West

Tuesday Nov the 18th

First part employed on the ship dandy still heading S.E. under whole topsails working to the wind for masts and sails Middle part strong wind & squally employed caulking fore line near the S. Boat the ship still leaks saw streaks in 24 hours so ends the Day
Lat by alt 11° 34' South
Long by Chron 129° 58' West

Wednesday Nov the 19th

First part employed on the ship dandy the ship heading S.E. still strong wind working to the wind to the masts and sails Middle part strong winds from the East the ship heading S.E. with heavy sea on employed fitting mizzen stay the ship still leaks saw streaks in 24 hours so ends the Day
Lat by alt 13° 20' South
Long by Chron 129° 45' West
