Saturday Dec 4th 1853
 These 24 hours begins with moderate
 winds from S W by West with fine weather
 ship steering S by East with all sail
 set at day light took in the fore royal
 watch employed in rattling the main
 rigging middle and latter part fresh breezes
 from S S W and fine weather ship heading
 S E so ends this day
 Lat by Obs 0 30 S
 Long by Chron 3, 31, 6

Sunday Dec 5th
 These 24 hours begins with fresh
 breezes from S W with fine weather ship
 heading S E half South with all sail set
 watch employed in ship duty at 2 P.M.
 saw the island of Anabon two points of the
 lee bow distant about 25 miles mid and
 latter part fine breezes from the S W
 so ends this day Lat by Obs 1, 11 S
 Long by Chron 3, 14 E
 Land Obs 4, 22, 6

 breezes from S W by W with fine weather
 ship heading S by E with main royal
 set at day light took in main royal
 sent down the fore royal yard on rose the
 rigging at seven A.M. watch employed in sending
 the fore topmast studdingsail and main top
 gallant studding booms down and unearring
 the the gear and housing the studdingsail
 at two A.M. the land bore E by North half
 North at twelve P.M. the land bore North
 by the compass watch employed in rattling
 the weather side of the main rigging and
 raising haw line for the bow boat
 at two P.M. lost sight of the land astern
 bearing about North by the compass
 middle and latter part fine breezes from the
 S W so ends this day. Lat by Obs 1, 52 S
 Long by Chron 6, 06 E

 Master Luna 3, 33, 6
