

Remarks on board the Bark Marion of

Saturday January 19th 1835

These 24 hours begin with light breeze from the S.W. with fine weather ship heading W.N.W. with her top sails, gill & spanker watch employed in looking blubber at day light saw two seals one off the weather quarter & the other adown at seven P.M. commenced cutting up the whale junk midday part cutting blubber at six and half were ship heading to the Eastward midday part much the same so ends this day boiling blubber

Sunday Jan 20th

These 24 hours began with moderate breeze from the S.W. with fine weather ship heading S.E. at day saw the Bark Mary Ann of the weather guard and saw a the brig Leonidas a cutting to the windward, at seven P.M. set the light sails at seven P.M. finished boiling at sun down took in the light sails midday and latter part wind and weather much the same ship heading S.E. so ends this day

Monday Jan 21st

These 24 hours begin with light wind from the S.W. with fine weather at day light midday heading W by S.W. at seven P.M. saw a sail to the seaward at half past nine P.M. stop the ship off for her it proved to be the S.W. at one P.M. saw the brig Leonidas boiling and the brig March heading to the Westward at sun down took in sail and took in sail

Tuesday January 22nd 1835

These 24 hours begin with fresh breeze from S.W. with fine weather ship heading S.E. at day light midday the gill and spanker & courses saw a brig to the seaward at seven P.M. started C.E. midday and latter part wind and weather much the same at one P.M. started S.E. at three P.M. saw Bark off the starboard bow heading to the eastward at sun down took in sail & luffed by the wind on the starboard tack heading S.E. so ends this day

Wednesday Jan 23rd

These 24 hours begin with fresh breezes from the S.W. with fine weather ship heading S.E. at four P.M. were ship heading West at day light set the courses gill & spanker saw the Bark Mary Ann off the weather bow heading to the Eastward, Watch employed in cooping oil at ten P.M. saw a sail off the weather beam at eleven P.M. saw another off the weather bow at nine P.M. started S.W. at two P.M. luffed by the wind heading west at sun down took in ship and hauled up the courses heading S.E. latter part much the same so ends this day

Thursday Jan 24th

These 24 hours begin with fresh breezes from the S.W. at day light rain set the courses at seven P.M. commenced breaking out in the fore hatch way on the starboard side we sailed to the forward at one P.M. started E.S.E. all hands employed in stowing away oil at sun down luffed by the wind heading S.E. so ends this day
