Saturday February 12th 1858
These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the S W ship heading S E at day light made sail saw a sail off the weather bow at one P.M. steered North with all useful sail set at four & spoke the North point of West point 30 S of S per. Three months & 2 out Capt. ~~Handcock~~ and gamed with her at eight & P.M. Capt South went on board heading West at 9 P.M. were ship heading S E so ends this day

Sunday Feb 13th
These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the S W ship heading S S E at day light made sail I saw two sails to the windward at seven A.M. steered E S E at four P.M. luffed by the wind heading S S E at sun down took in sail all but the topsail of 8 & spoke the latter part much the same so ends this day

Monday Feb 14th
These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the S W ship heading S S E at day light made sail ^{with one ship} at one P.M. steered S N E with all useful sail set at five P.M. saw two sails of the Starboard beam at sun down took in sail and luffed by the wind on the Starboard tack heading S N E at 10 P.M. spoke the latter part much the same so ends this day

Tuesday February 13th 1858
These 24 hours begins moderate breeze from the S W ship heading S S E at day light made sail and were ship heading N N W saw the Chocomailla and the Wooda-vised, watch employed in turning up the fore top gallant backsails at 12 1/2 P.M. steered S N E with all sail set watch employed in turning in the Main top gallant backsails at sun down took in sail and luffed by the wind on the Starboard tack latter part much the same so ends this day

Wednesday Feb 20th
These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the S W ship heading S E at day light made sail saw two vessels to the windward middle part light wind and baffling at one P.M. steered E S E with all sail set at sun down took in sail and luffed by the wind on the Starboard tack latter part wind from the S W ship heading S S E so ends this day
Lat by Obs 650 S
Long by Chron 10,05 E

Thursday Feb 21st
These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the S W at daylight made sail and steered N E during the day saw five sails middle part fresh breezes from S W at one P.M. steered E N E with all sail set at four P.M. squally at 4 P.M. closed up all sail and luffed the topsails saw one vessel much thinner and lightning at 6 P.M. were ship the weather more moderate breeze so ends this day
