

Remarks on Board the Bark Marion of

Friday February 22nd 1856

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the south ship heading WSW at day light made all sail at 10 from the old W ship heading West saw the brig March and the bark Albatross to the forward middle part with employed in breaking water in the main hatch way middle part fresh breezes at sun down took in sail. latter part more moderate so ends this day

Saturday Feb 23rd

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the SW ship heading west at day light made sail at 9 AM and abreast to the seaward sun off for it but did not see any thing more of it at eleven AM saw fin backs to the windward at twelve AM took in sail heading SE with all sail set at four PM saw a sail to the windward running down four at sun down hauled aback for her and took in the light sails middle part fresh breezes latter part more moderate

at seven PM spoke the George & Mary about came on board Capt De vol from months out with four bbls of Bk oil gun until seven PM then were ship heading SE so ends this day

New Bedford Alfred C Davis Master 1856

Sunday February 24th 1856

These 24 hours begins with light breezes the SW ship heading SE at day light made sail saw the George & Mary off the lee quarter heading to the Customa at 12 1/2 PM steered E by S at 3 1/4 PM spoke the George & Mary and came with her steering E by S with all sail set at sun down took in sail at seven PM the Capt came on board hauled forward heading SE latter part moderate so ends this day

Monday Feb 25th

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the SW ship heading SE at day light made sail saw the George & Mary off the lee bow at 11 AM A.M. steered E by S at nine AM wind from SW saw a vessel to the forward middle part wind and weather much the same at two PM steered NNE with all useful sail set at sun down took in sail and duffed by the wind on the starboard tack heading SE latter much the same so ends this day

Tuesday Feb 26th

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the SW with cloudy & smoky weather ship heading SE at 9 1/2 AM were ship heading West at day light made sail at seven AM saw nothing bunches of grass at 12 1/2 PM steered to the at sun down were seen a vessel in sight and spoken by the wind heading SE middle latter part wind & weather much the same
