

Remarks on board the Bark *Thames* of New

Tuesday March 4th 1838

These 24 hours began with moderate breeze from the W. S. W. with fine weather ship heading South at day light commenced sailing in at nine & at seven a vessel off the S. E. beam at 9³⁰ finished cutting in and made all sail except the main sail musta put light breeze from the S. E. W. at one P. M. tacked ship all hands employed in clearing away the head & cutting flukes at two P. M. commenced sailing at three P. M. tacked ship heading west at sun down took in the light sails latter part wind & weather much the same so ends this day sailing flukes

Wednesday March 5th

These 24 hours begin with moderate breezes from the S. W. ship heading W. S. W. at day light tacked ship and set the light sail at 10¹⁵ A. M. finished sailing middle part fresh breezes at one P. M. set the main sail at sun down shorten sail ship heading S. E. latter part much the same so ends this day

Thursday March 6th

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the S. E. W. with fine weather ship heading West at day light made sail at eight A. M. commenced speaking and was in the main hatchway at half past eleven A. M. saw dark breeches off the S. E. beam at seven A. M. tacked ship at eight and set any thing more of the main sail & had her

Beaufort Alfred & Davis Master 1838

Friday March 7th 1838

These 24 hours began with strong breezes from S. E. W. ship heading W. S. W. at day light wore ship & made sail ship heading S. E. at seven & A. M. steered. East middle part more moderate at two & half P. M. set the fore top gallant sail at sun down took in sail & luffed by the wind heading S. E. latter part light breezes so ends this day

Long by Chron 10.44 E

Saturday March 8th

These 24 hours begin with light breezes from the S. W. ship heading S. E. at day made sail & steered S. E. middle part wind much the same at 12¹⁵ P. M. steered N. E. W. at two P. M. saw breeches to the windward luffed up for them proved to be pinkies at 3¹⁵ P. M. steered N. E. W. again at sun down took in sail & luffed by the wind on starboard tack ship heading South latter part light breezes so ends these 24 hours

Long by Chron 11.21 E

Sunday March 9th

These 24 hours begin with strong breezes from the S. E. W. ship heading S. E. wore ship heading West at day light made sail & steered W. S. W. middle part strong breezes from the S. W. at two P. M. saw two sails on the weather bow steering to the northward & the other off the lar quarter heading to the Eastward at sun down took in sail & luffed by the wind wind from the S. W. ship heading West
