

Remarks on board the Bask Marion of New

Monday April 14th 1856

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes
from the W S W with fine weather ship heading
South at day light made all sail two sails
in sight Middle part moderate breezes
watch employed in heaving and water in the
main hatch way & pursuing chains one sail in
sight Latter part at sun down shortened sail
ship heading South and with the wind from
the S S W
Set by Ob 648 S
Long by Chs 1932 E

Tuesday April 15th

These 24 hours begins with moderate
breezes from the S.W. with fine weather
ship heading S.E. at day slight wind
from the S.W. were ship & made sail
heading by the wind W.N.W. passed to the
windward of the Brig Leonidas Middle past
fresh breezes from the S.S.W. at 9 1/2 A.M.
set the fore topgallant sail saw porpoises
Latter part one sail in sight at sun down
shorten sail ship heading West with moderate
breezes at 12 P.M. were ship heading S.E.
so ends this day Sat the 26 1794
Long by Chas 1033

Wednesday April 16th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the SSW ship heading S E with fine weather at day light wore ship & made sail heading NNE had sails in sight saw five packs Middle part moderate & puffing breezes from SSW to WSW ship heading by the line latter part at sun down took ship & took in sail ship heading South to anchor this day. I

Bedford Alfred C Davis Master 1838

Thursday April 19th 1856

These 24 hours begins with moderate
breezes from the SSW with pleasant weather
Ship heading SE A day light made all
sail one fish hook Middle part wind from
the S.W., at 12 1/2 M steered off E by S & 1/2 M
saw a sail at 4 P.M. a bark passed to the
windward of us steering to the westward Latter part
at sun down shorten sail & luffed by the wind
heading South at 12 P.M. were ship heading
NW & ends this day. Lat by 15448 S
Long by 15022 E

Friday April 18th

These 29th days began with moderate
breezes from the S.W. with fine weather
Ship heading W. by N. at day light were
ship & made all sail and steered off S by E
the Bark Mattapoisett pass ahead of us
steering to the Eastward & the ship
Leonard pass to the downward steering to the
Westward. At the first light breeze we
steered off S. E. & reported it was contrary
sail & capped by the wind blowing S. E. with the
Bark Mattapoisett in sight ahead at 12
noon ship was from the S.W. ship heading W. by N.
so ends this day

Saturday April 12th

These 24 boats began with fresh breezes
 from the S.W. with fine weather ship hoisting
 "W. S. W." at 4 P.M. here ship heading at S.E.
 and on day 12 we were with sail & kept N.E. & E.
 we went on at 10 A.M. at 11 P.M. with in the night
 fine fair breeze at N.W. & S.W. at 1 P.M. wind
 "W. S. W." at 4 P.M. at 10 P.M. sail hoisted at 11 P.M.
 the wind at 1 P.M. at 11 P.M. at 11 P.M. at 11 P.M.
