Monday April 21st
These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes
from the S. W. with fine weather ship heading
S. W. at day light were ship & made sail
ship heading S. S. E. Midnight past wind from
the S. S. W. cloudy & smoky weather with some
rain at one & half P. M. hauled off S. E. and sail
in sight to the windward latter part moderate
breezes at sun down shorten sail & luffed by the
wind heading South at 11 P. M. hauled back the
fore topsail this day ends with fresh breezes
Lat by Obs 4.33
Long by Obs 10.61

Tuesday April 22nd
These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes
from the S. W. with fine weather ship heading
S. S. E. with the fore topsail aback at day light
sailed off S. E. at 10 AM luffed by the wind
at 12 noon breezes and sail at 1 P. M. luffed by the wind
heading S. E. wind from the S. S. W. at 3 P. M. hauled
the heading West at 4 P. M. at sundown
shorten sail ship heading West at 11 P. M. past high
wind at night for purposes at 12 P. M. at 11 P. M.
at sundown ship was at Lat by Obs 42.5
Long by Obs 103.38

Wednesday April 23rd 1858
These 24 hours begins with light breezes from
the S. S. W. with pleasant weather ship heading West
at day light made sail at 1 P. M. watch employed
in heaving out in the after hatch was Middle part
wind & weather much the same at 5 P. M. heaved off
S. S. E. at sun down shorten sail & luffed by the
wind on the Starboard tack heading S. E. latter part
light breezes so ends this day Lat by Obs 43.3
Long by Obs 104.38

Thursday April 24th
These 24 hours begins with light breezes
from the S. S. W. with fine weather ship heading
S. E. at 1 P. M. luffed a porpoise at day light
made sail & stored off S. S. W. Midnight past
moderate breezes watch employed in setting
the head stows at 2 P. M. wind from the S. W.
latter part wind & weather much the same
at sundown shorten sail luffed by the wind
on the Starboard tack heading S. S. W. so ends
the same Lat by Obs 44.3
Long by Obs 104.20

Friday April 25th
These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes
from the S. S. W. with pleasant weather ship
heading West at day light made sail &
stored off S. E. Midnight past wind & weather
much the same saw finbacks porpoises & shoals
of fish at 2 P. M. watch employed in heaving
out water from the holdway latter part wind
from the S. W. at sun down shorten sail &
luffed by the wind on the Starboard tack heading
S. E. so ends this day
