

Remarks on board the Bark Union of this

Saturday May 17th 1852

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S.W. and pleasant at 4 P.M. the Captain went on shore the watches employed in clearing decks Middle paid pleasant at 3 P.M. have shot at 5 P.M. the Captain came on board at 8 P.M. weight anchor & made all fast & 8 P.M. saw two stars to the West latter paid at 1 P.M. the weather was the same

Sunday May 18th

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the Southward & Westward with rainy weather ship heading by the wind West the S.W. point of the island bearing S.W. a day behind the ship south of the Weather gauge at 8 P.M. watch employed in stowing chains Middle paid rainy at 10 P.M. fair with light air and calm Middle paid pleasant light air from the Eastward at sundown the S.W. point of Fernando bearing S.W. 1/2 W and 15 miles S.E. point bearing S.W. 1/2 E the ship Sarah of the Cuba beam ship heading to the Westward and the same

Monday May 19th

These 24 hours begins with light air from the Eastward & pleasant ship steering W by S with all sail set Middle paid with & weather much the same steering West W latter part light air and calm at sun down the S.W. point of the island bearing by compass S.E. by E and 15 miles the ship Sarah off the harbor bearing in a light breeze and pleasant

Tuesday May 20th 1852

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the Westward with squally & rainy weather accompanied with thunder & lightning ship heading by the wind to the Southward & Westward Middle paid pleasant with light air & calm at 4 P.M. rainy with thunder and lightning wind from the South ship steering West when the wind would abate at sun down fresh breezes from the West ship heading by the wind S.W. 1/2 E bearing S.E. & South point the ship Sarah in sight latter paid calm Lat 3.11. N

Wednesday May 21st

These 24 hours begins with calm & pleasant at 4 P.M. light breezes from the W.S.W. ship heading S by W with all sail set Middle paid wind & weather much the same latter paid moderate breezes from the S.W. W & pleasant ship heading by the wind S by E and the same Lat 3.11. N Long 63.50 E

Thursday May 22nd

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from S.W. by W ship heading S by E with all sail set at 4 P.M. wind from the S.E. weather squally & ship & steered S.W. by W Middle paid pleasant wind from from the South latter paid fresh breezes from the S.W. ship heading by the wind West steering S.W. by West when the wind would abate one sail in sight at 2 P.M. wind from the S.W. W at 4 P.M. the ship Sarah heading S by E and the same Lat 3.11. N Long 63.50 E
