

Remarks on board the Bark Mission of

Thursday June 12th 1836

These 24 hours begins with light breeze from the S.W. ship heading S.E. & pleasant weather at 2 P.M. were ship heading West at day light set all sail Middle part wind weather much the same 3 P.M. saw a sail at sun down shorten sail & tacked ship heading S.E. by S with one sail in sight latter part much the same weather this day Lat by Obs 44° 48' Long by Chron 192° 5'

Friday June 13th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the S.W. & pleasant ship heading S.E. at 4 P.M. were ship heading West at day light set all sail at 12th M. tacked ship at 3 P.M. spoke the Bark Catharine Capt. Henry of New Bedford 9 months and 200 sp. 18° Whale at 5 P.M. finish gaming & sun down shorten sail heading S.E. latter part much the same Lat by Obs 44° 10' Long by Chron 192° 42'

Saturday June 14th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the S.W. & pleasant ship heading S.E. at day light set all sail the Bark Catharine off the lee beam Middle part pleasant at 1st P.M. steered off S.E. & saw sail in sight at sun down shorten sail & tacked by the wind heading S.E. latter part wind & weather much the same at 12 P.M. were ship Lat by Obs 44° 34' Long by Chron 192° 35'

New Bedford Alfred C. Davis Master 1836

Sunday June 15th 1836

These 24 hours begins with light breeze from the S.W. & pleasant ship heading West at day light set all sail at 4 P.M. steered W.N.W. & sail in sight Middle part pleasant at 11th A.M. luffed by the wind at 12 A.M. spoke the Bark Grey Heron Capt. Wm. off Westport 23 months and 200 sp. 100th at 5th P.M. tacked ship heading S.E. wind from the S.W. at sun down shorten sail & sail in sight latter part 10 P.M. finish gaming & brace forward ends the same Lat by Obs 44° 23' Long by Chron 192° 5'

Monday June 16th

These 24 hours begins with baffling breezes from S.W. off to South & pleasant ship heading S.E. off to East at day light set all sail the Bark Grey Heron the Bark Dora in sight Middle part light & pleasant breeze at 9 P.M. lowered the Boats & placed them up back but did not stick at 11th came on board & steered to the Southward & Eastward at sun down shorten sail ship heading S.E. latter part pleasant & light air from the S.W. ship heading S.E. Lat by Obs 44° 28' Long by Chron 192° 35'

Tuesday June 17th

These 24 hours begins with light & baffling breezes from the Southward & Westward ship heading to the Southward & Eastward at day light set all sail the ship in sight Middle part wind & weather much the same at 1 P.M. saw for Back 122 P.M. lower and chased 2 P.M. came on board at sun down tacked ship & heading ship heading W.N.W. at 11 P.M. were ship
