

Remarks on Board the Bark Mission of

Wednesday June 18th 1850
These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S.W. & pleasant weather ship heading S.E. at day light were ship & set all sail steered N.W. Middle part pleasant wind from the South, at sun down shorten sail & luffed by the wind heading West N. Latter part light air & calm so calm this day. Lat by Obs 63° 28' N Long by Chron 109° 19' E

Thursday June 19th
These 24 hours begins with light air from the S.W. & pleasant ship heading West at day light set all sail at 6:30 A.M. steered off N.W. Middle part pleasant breeze 2 sails in sight, at 1 P.M. steered East, at sundown shorten sail & luffed by the wind on Starboard tack heading S.E. one sail in sight. Latter part much the same so calm this day. Lat by Obs 63° 36' N Long by Chron 109° 38' E

Friday June 20th
These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from S.W. & fine weather ship heading S.E. at daylight were ship and set all sail spoke the Bark Caroline of Greenport Capt. Markson Middle part at 9 A.M. steered off N.W. at 1 P.M. steered E. three sails in sight at sundown shorten sail & luffed by the wind heading S.E. Latter part much the same. Lat by Obs 63° 44' N Long by Chron 109° 19' E

New Bedford Alfred C. Davis Master 1850

Saturday June 21st 1850
These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the South & pleasant weather, at 2 A.M. were ship heading W.S.W. at day light set all sail, at 1 P.M. steered off N.W. Middle part fresh breezes & heavy at 12 1/2 M two Barks appeared to the windward steering to the S. & E. and at 1 1/2 P.M. luffed around by the wind on the starboard tack heading S.E. & S. at 2 1/2 P.M. saw a spruce to the windward luffed ship for it but did not see it again at 3 P.M. saw large breeches off the weather beam about 8 miles distant at 3 P.M. luffed around but did not see any more of it at sundown took in the main course and light sails ship heading S.E. Latter part wind & weather much the same Lat by Obs 62° 51' N Long by Chron 109° 58' E

Sunday June 22nd
These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from the S.W. with fine weather ship heading S.E. at day light set all sail at 6 1/2 A.M. steered off S.E. Middle part pleasant wind from the S.W. saw four Barks, two sails in sight at 12 1/2 M steered off N.E. & at sun down shorten sail & luffed by the wind on the starboard tack ship heading S.E. Latter part much the same so calm these 24 hours. Lat by Obs 63° 28' N Long by Chron 109° 28' E

Monday June 23rd
These 24 hours begins with light breezes from S.W. with pleasant weather ship heading S.E. at day light were ship & set all sail steered off N.W. at 9 A.M. luffed by the wind heading N.W. & W. in sight at 12 1/2 M steered N.W. at 3 1/2 P.M. saw three Barks ahead at sun down shorten sail luffed by the wind heading W. Middle part fresh breezes in sight at 4 P.M. ship Lat by Obs 63° 15' N Long by Chron 109° 16' E
