

Remarks on board the Bark Marion of New

Sunday July 20<sup>th</sup> 1836

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. & pleasant weather ship heading S.E. at day light set sail. Middle part fresh breezes sail for & hump backs at sundown shorten sail ship heading S.E. Latter part wind and weather much the same

Lat by Obs 32° S  
Long by Chron 84° E

Monday July 21<sup>st</sup>

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the S.W. and pleasant ship heading S.E. at day light set sail. Middle part saw porpoises watch employed in washing the outside of the ship at sun down shorten sail ship heading S.E. Latter part fresh breezes at 12 P.M. bore ship

Long by Chron 102° E

Tuesday July 22<sup>nd</sup>

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.W. & pleasant ship heading West at day light set sail. Middle part saw two sails at 4 1/2 P.M. humped ship at sun down shorten sail at 6 P.M. spoke & passed with the Bark Oceana 22 months out 530 W of which 250 of space at 9 1/2 P.M. finished garning breezes from S.W. heading S.E. even with fresh breezes

Wednesday July 23<sup>rd</sup>

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. & pleasant weather ship heading S.E. at day light set sail & steered off N.W. one sail in sight. Middle part saw hump backs at 9 1/2 P.M. steered N.W. watch employed in backing and for water at 12 1/2 - No steered off N.W. sail in sight at sun down shorten sail & buffed by the wind heading West and the ship

Bark Marion Alfred C. Davis Master 1836

Thursday July 24<sup>th</sup> 1836

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. the weather smoky ship heading N.W. at 3 1/2 P.M. wore ship at day light set sail & steered off East. Made part at 2 P.M. steered N.E. one sail in sight at 3 P.M. saw hump backs at 4 1/2 P.M. spoke the Bark Oceana 22 months out 530 W of which 250 of space at sundown shorten sail & buffed by the wind heading S.E. Latter part strong breezes at 8 P.M. finished garning, even much the same

Long by Chron 102° E

Friday July 25<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the S.W. & pleasant weather ship heading S.E. at day light steered off N.E. and set sail the Bark Oceana in sight saw hump backs. Middle part light buffing breezes from S.W. off to S.E. at 4 P.M. buffed by the wind heading to the Southward & Eastward at sundown took in the light sail ship heading East. Latter part at 8 P.M. in ship wind from the S.E. ship heading South

Saturday July 26<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S.W. & pleasant ship heading South at day light set sail. Middle part at 10 P.M. humped ship at 11 P.M. lowered the boats & humped but did not start at 10 1/2 P.M. occurred a squall at 12 P.M. wore ship from the S.W. ship heading N.W. at 4 1/2 P.M. humped ship heading N.W. Latter part much the same
