

Remarks on board Bark Union of New

Friday Sep 12<sup>th</sup> 1836

These 24 hours begins with light pleasant breezes from the Southward & Eastward and fine weather. Middle part pleasant. No catches employed in catching fish. Latter part at 6 P.M. finished catching ends with fine weather.

Saturday Sep 13<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the SE weather fine at 6 A.M. stowed the Starboard anchor & chain at 1 P.M. hove short.

Middle part pleasant & fresh breezes from sea at 3 P.M. got under way & stood out to the wind to the Southward & Westward with all sail set. Wind from SE. Latter part strong breezes & show weather at 3 P.M. took in the fore top gallant sail ends much the same.

Sunday Sep 14<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the SE & pleasant weather ship heading S.W. & a rough sea on with main top gallant sail set at 1 P.M. the eye bolt of the spraker got away. Middle part pleasant watch employed in getting spraker got at 3 P.M. the fore line got blew to pieces. Latter part wind from SE.

Monday Sep 15<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the SE and squally weather with a rough sea ship heading S.W. with main top gallant sail set at 1 P.M. went in the fore line got. Middle and latter part wind & weather much the same.

Tuesday Sep 16<sup>th</sup> 1836

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the SE and squally weather ship heading S.W. with main top gallant sail set. Middle part at 3 P.M. set the fore top sail saw fin backs and fishes. Latter part pleasant at 6 P.M. set fore top gallant sail and stowage ends the same. Lat 36° 23' N Long 73° 23' W

Wednesday Sep 17<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours begins with fine weather and fresh breezes from the SE with all sail set. Middle part pleasant watch employed in drinking out in the fore and after hatch bay and mending flying jib at 3 P.M. wind from the South took ship heading E.S.E. saw fin backs and small black fish. Latter part moderate breezes.

Thursday 18<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the South and pleasant weather ship heading E.S.E. Middle part baffling breezes from Southward to SE watch employed in mending flying jib at 6 P.M. finished and bent it. Latter part squally.

These 24 hours begins with fresh and baffling breezes from SE & S.W. to SE and squally. Ship heading by the wind to the Eastward with all sail set. Middle part saw fin backs. Latter part wind and weather much the same.
