

Remarks on board Bark Herion of New

Wednesday Dec. 11th 1836

These 24 hours begin with light breeze from the Northward & Westward weather rising ship heaving by the wind to the Southward & Eastward at 3 P.M. the light sail - No sail left - rain at 11 1/2 clock ship heaving to the Westward. Latter part calm the same at sun down light breeze from the Eastward ship steering East N. 1/2 S. sound. Set to 1/2

Thursday 18th

These 24 hours they ran with moderate breezes from
 the South. weather fair ship heading by the wind NW^W
 with all sail set, Wind the first pleasant & fresh breezes
 from that W at 11 P.M. backed ship at 12 P.M. & steered
 off ESE & sail for prizes. I run seven shorter sail & buffed
 by the wind heading SE by at latter part much the same
 Lat by 16th 4, 30
 Long by 6th 8, 35

Friday the 15th

Dec 24. Weather begins with fresh breezes from S.W.
weather fair ship heading N.E. & drops anchor and sails
& stands off East Attitude point fair & 12 M. off by the wind
at anchor & hooked ship & then turns and heading N.E. W
sails part with the same. Lat Dec 24 41° 5' N
Long Dec 24 82° 5' W

Saturday 20th

Mixed & browned by with pleasant fragrance from 2'8
at 1 mile more shortening and together pleasant
at each side of it, at 6 m. to 7 m. short.
Pleasant part pleasant, at sundown shorter and
shortening (H). Latter part further into 4, 11
Jan. 1890. 242.

Sunday 21st

These 24 hours began with strong breeze from the N. weather was clear, the ship heading N. E. & at 10 AM. sail & Redoubt part wind & weather much the same latter part more moderate wind from N. Bedford Alfred C Davis Master 1840

Monday Dec 22nd 1882

These 24 hours Obains with light breezes from S.E.
weathers foggy ship heading to the Westward. At day light
and rain, but a light backed ship & steered S.W.
Middle part weathers much the same, wind from the Eastward
at 12 1/2 M. shifted S.W. wind light, at sundown
shifted about & backed to the wind, ship heading S.W.
 Latter part, light breeze, fine clear weather. Sailed at 4 PM
- arrived at 12.40

Monday 25th

These 25 sails arrived with us at 10 o'clock. The
 weather fair ship heading S.E. at day light. ~~Passing~~
 Middle part went under the snow, weather smoother, it snowed
 down thick as ship & short soon had heading N.W. at 12 o'clock
 over the snow at 12 o'clock ship. Lat by obs 48° 25'
 Long by obs 24° 0'

26th We arrived at 9 o'clock

O'Nealsbury, N.Y.

These 20 birds alighted with light airs blowing white heading
to weather fair at 2 1/2 I shot the lowest from the
south, red shirt & stored off R.C. Middle head away
at 12 1/2 M returned ship, it was down shorter sail
and buffed by the wind heading W.S.B. latter part
light breeze

These 24 hours begins with light & success from
the South ship, blowing to that Eastward at daylight
set sail & drove off N by E. Made the start but
watch employed in watching before they could sail

fish lowered the spars & the other saved boat struck in
A sun down shorter sail & buffed by the wind (cutting) W
rather fast much the same, Sat by 4 1/2 Long 10,00

Friday 26th

All these 24 hours we had over from the weather fine ship breasting. We were just at the anchorage in morning the wind was gathered and out we went. But we started with a fair breeze.
