wind to the Southward & Eastward with all sails set

at 1 o'clock steered S.E. Latter part at sunset short
sail ship heading by the wind S.E. by South and the same
Lat by Obs S
Long by Chron E

Saturday the 28th
These 24 hours begin with light breezes from S.W.
weather fair ship heading S.E. at sea light & sail
at 3 o'clock steered off S.E. weather much the same
Middle part at 1 o'clock light & sail ship from S.W. to S.E.
steering S.E. when by wind permitted ^{light breeze} some freshen,
at 1 o'clock over the water sail & buffed by the wind heading S.E.
Latter part much the same at 2 o'clock ship Lat 4. 38 E
Long 9. 24 E

Sunday March the 1st 1834

some freshen at 12 o'clock ship, winds from S.W. to S.E.
ship heading from S.W. to S.E. at sunset short sail
