Saturday Dec 4th

These 24 hours being with moderate breezes from N.E. & weather pleasant. Ship's pressure at 11 AM the first fresh & buffing wind came from E. to South. Watchmen on in washing ship. Tally put string buoys at 5 AM out in the light water. At 6 AM moderate E. breeze from N.E. to East sounds. Lat on 13 Dec 33

Ther 24 hours business with moderate breeze & drifting
from S S E off to E Ship Steaming S W with Peak 1st
1 Mideel & latter part strong breeze lat 40 30 S

Long Lybno 22, 22 1/2

Monday The 6th

There are low, boisterous with strong breezes from S.W. weather pleasant
The morning S.W. with all sail set at 9 A.M. got the gale
up in the afternoon but wind & weather much the same as before
The morning being got at 12 P.M. and at 1 P.M. the ship was
at anchor. The wind was S.W. and the weather was clear. The ship was
at anchor at 3 P.M.

Wednesday April 2nd 1834

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from S.E.
weather pleasant Ship steering S.W. with all sail set
Middle part at 12 1/2 M. land the island of St. Vincent
1/2 point of behind 60 miles distant is then land at 4 1/4 PM
Ship steering from S.W. to W. by S. 1/2 S. & then direct land
bearing W by S 1/2 S 10 miles ^{distance} S. by E.
S. by E.

Long Steeple

Wednesday Feb 8th

These six hours begin with moderate breezes from S.E. Ship
hoisting off with on off game taken. At 10 light land the coast
at 10¹⁵ B. G. comes to anchor under the Pt. of Sinder hill in 13
fathoms of water with a number off Whiting & Rockcod weets
Bark No 3 to them. Middleford pleasure all hands
employed in clearing Ship and getting pleasure in air

St Helens 2^d Thursday Feb 2^d

These 2 specimens were with light & reddish brown from the S.E.
at Southport & measured 1 1/2 inches high. Middle & latter
part yellowish at a S.W. finished painting white.
