St. Helena Thidag April 24th 1881

Sec. Account, these 24 hours begins with fine pleasant weather cooper employed in setting up shooks Middle part fresh breeze & rainy Latter part pleasant Cooper employed in flugging casks Ends the same

Saturday 25th

These 24 hours begins with fine weather & fresh breeze Cooper employed in flugging casks at 2 P.M. all hands employed in taking down the main hatch cover at 4 P.M. two men come on board which the Capt had shipped from the ship. Provision of New London names Middle part fine Latter part much the same at 2 P.M. received Thos. Gallagher on board in iron 20 Ends

Sunday 26th

These 24 hours begins with fine pleasant weather at 1 P.M. Bay comes on board from the Hospital at 4 P.M. we reached Anchor and stood out to sea with all sail set heading S.W. left Mr. Coffin ashore Dock at 1 P.M. steamed the Anchors Middle part fresh breeze Ship heading S.W. at day light the land bearing N.E. by E Dist about 48 miles at 4 P.M. steamed the Anchor took Thos. Gallagher out of iron Latter part moderate breeze Ends the same

Monday 27th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from S.E. weather smoky Ship heading S.W. Middle part fresh & buffing breezes & squalls from the S.E. Latter part Iron breeze at 4 P.M. tacked Ship heading from S.E. to E.S.E. at 10 P.M. a merchant Ship passed ahead of us Steaming to the S.W. Ends with fine weather

Tuesday April 28th 1881

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.E. & pleasant weather Ship heading E.S.E. at 6 P.M. tacked Ship heading S. by W. Middle part squalls Latter part at 1 P.M. tacked Ship heading E.S.E. weather smoky Ends the same

Long by Obs. 149. W.

Wednesday 29th

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.E. Ship heading E.S.E. with all sail set except the Fore Top Gallant sail weather squalls & drizzle Middle & Latter part fresh & buffing breezes from S.E. to E.S.E. & passing squalls of rain Ship heading on different tacks Ends with fine weather

Lat by Obs. 17.08 S.
Long by Obs. 148. W.

Thursday 30th

These 24 hours begins with moderate & buffing breezes from S.E. to E.S.E. weather smoky Ship heading from E.S.E. to S.E. watch employed in painting ship inside at 1 P.M. spoke the Bark Sumner Thomas of Southampton in charge by the chief mate. at sun down 2 sails in sight Middle part fresh breezes & cloudy weather Latter part Iron breezes from S.E. at day light took in the light sails at 10 P.M. took in the main sail watch employed in painting. ends the same

Friday May 1st

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.E. & weather smoky Ship heading S. under easy sail, watch employed in painting ship & sundown tacked Ship & set the main sail heading S.W. by E. Middle and Latter part moderate breezes, weather has S. tacked Ship heading E. by S. at 8 P.M. at 10 P.M. took in the sail and
