Wednesday Aug 3rd 1847

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the South
 High Steering West we alter anchor at sundown
 Shorten sail & suffer by the wind holding W & NW with
 light air. Middle & latter part pleasant breezes from S W
 at day light set sail & steered off N E saw porpoises & sail
 in sight 20 Ends

Thursday the 4th

These 24 hours begins with light & pleasant breezes from N.W.
steering Ship N.E. at sundown shortens sail & buffed by the
wind heading W. by N. Midship & Letter put pleasant
at day light. Wet sail & stored N. and small black
fish & a merchant brig & the R.L. in sight so ends
1st of Oct. 1885

Friday 3^d M.

Three 24 hours began with light & pleasant breezes
from S. S. W. at 12 1/2 N. Sailed N. N. W. at 3 1/2
P. M. spoke the R. L. & gained at sundown Shorten sail
huffed by the wind heading W. Middle & Saller part
faded at day light set sail & sailed S. S. W.
R. L. in sight 50 Ends sent by Ch. 9 10
Sinc. C. 10 10 10 10

Saturday 6th

these 24 hours. Breeze with light winds from S.W.
 weather cloudy & drizzly at 12 1/2. We were rounded & steered
 E.S.E. at sun down shortened sail & luffed by the wind
 heading S.E. With the good breeze from the South
 at 2 P.M. we were Ship heading N.W. at day light set
 sail. Little good much time wore to L in sight. L.D. 4.07
 Long 8.21

Sunday 7th

These 24 hours business with fresh breezes from the South Ship
hanging NW & it wind down tacked this heading S & E
at 12.00 in latter part pleasant at 1.15. A 2nd looked Ship
about 1.30. The 2nd looked Ship about 2.30. The 3rd looked Ship about 3.30.

Monday June the 8th 1834

These 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from S.W. & pleasant weather. Ship heading West, at sundown Warped Ship heading S.E. Weather & latter part wind & weather much the same. Lat. 40. Obs 4 p.m. 18

Friday the 9th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from N.E. & W.
with pleasant weather at 10 A.M. Stead. Ebb. To our tin Barks
at 10 A.M. short sail & buffed by the wind heading S.E.
At 1 P.M. latter part pleasant at 1 P.M. Stead. S.E.
at 8 P.M. Stead. With our tin Barks over Litter Ch. 3.20 S.
Latter part pleasant at 1 P.M. Stead. S.E.

Wednesday the 10th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from S by S
with a smother S at 12 2 B steered N.E. at sun down
shorten sail & buffed by the wind Ship heading E S E
Middle & latter part drizzly & foggy at day break set sail
Ship heading S E by E with light wind Ends with fresh breeze

Thursday the 11th

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from the South
weather pleasant Ship heading S.E. sail Tinn Brels
at sun down weather sail. Ship heading S.E. Middle
grad Ship heading on different track. Ship pleasant at day light
at sail at eve locked Ship heading to the Westward Set by Oct 4/12
Sail by Nov 9/12

Friday 12th

these 24 hours being with light & pleasant breezes from the South
at 2 P.M. touched Ship. at 4 1/2 P.M. spoke the bark Red
Barrow & gained at midnight shorter sail Ship heading E & E
middle part pleasant latter part at daylight at sail
at 6 P.M. touched Ship. bark Red brought at 10 A.M. said
school of Sperm Whales going to the NE at 1 P.M. heard
and observed 20 or 25 birds ^{the sea was rough} South in chase. D. 15 to 17
