

Remarks on board of bark Aquion of New

Thursday Sept 27th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes & buffing breezes from S.W. till 11 AM ship heading to windward with all sail set Middle part ship heading S.E. by S. Latter part at day light tacked ship heading W by S. All hands employed in stowing down oil. 10 Casks 1000 lbs. Long 1000

Wednesday 30th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from S.W. ship heading W by S. Weather fair all hands stowing oil in the main hold. at 4 PM fresh breezes at 1 PM tacked ship heading S.E. Middle & Latter part much the same. Long 1000

Thursday Oct 1st

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from S.W. ship heading on different tacks. Cooper employed in flugging upper all sundown ship heading S.E. Middle & Latter part much the same. Long 1000

Friday Oct 2nd

These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from S.W. ship heading S.E. at 2 PM altered S.E. by S. Middle part at 2 PM windward to the Eastward. Tacked ship heading to the Southward at day light saw the land distant about 25 miles. Latter part wind from the S.W. ship steering down with the land at 9 PM. Long 1000

Saturday the 3rd

These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from S.W. ship steering to the North & Eastward with the land at 5 PM. came at anchor in Bay of St. Paul. Boat in 10 fathoms of water with a number of merchandise. with downed sea breezes weather pleasant

These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from S.W. at 5 PM the bark De Franklin arrived here. Capt. Russell of Westport with 500 lbs. 11 months out. Latter part Starboard Watch on liberty

Monday the 5th

These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from S.W. Starboard watch on liberty. Middle & Latter part pleasant the Starboard watch on liberty. 10 Casks

Tuesday the 6th

These 24 hours begins with fine and pleasant breezes from the Westward. Starboard Watch on liberty. Middle & Latter part much the same the Starboard watch on liberty

Wednesday the 7th

These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from the S.W. Starboard watch on liberty. Middle & Latter part wind & weather much the same

Thursday 8th

These 24 hours begins with light & pleasant breezes from the Westward. Starboard Watch on liberty at 12 PM a launch came aboard with water 25 lbs. Middle & Latter part wind & weather much the same Capt. 1000

Friday 9th

These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from the Westward at 3 PM received on board 1000 lbs. potatoes. Capt. 1000 Middle & Latter part much the same sold the Ship of New York 25 galls of Sp. 200 per gal

Saturday the 10th

These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from the Westward Middle & Latter part much the same
