

Remarks on board of Bark Marion of New

Wednesday Jan 20th 1838
these 24 hours begin with pleasant weather with
land & sea breezes at 12 M. No wind ashore to cut wood
and getting it off at 8 PM. P.M. raining with thunder & lightning
and out remounts of the lumber cable Middle part thunder &
lightning in the E. Latter part thunder & lightning and
raining at 10 P.M. had a light typhoon

Thursday 21st
these 24 hours begin with light breezes & the weather
overcast & all hands employed in cutting & getting off wood
Middle part pleasant Latter part the same all hands
getting off & cutting wood so Ends

Friday 22nd
these 24 hours begin with pleasant weather all hands
employed in cutting about fresh water & storing away wood
Middle pleasant Latter part all hands getting off wood
& storing down fresh water ends breaking out wood in the after
part of day

Saturday 23rd
these 24 hours begin with pleasant weather all hands
getting off water & storing wood & cables & stored it away
Middle part pleasant Latter part storing off in the
after part of day at 11 A.M. took our anchors & stood out
to sea heading W with all sail set by the wind
so Ends

Sunday 24th
these 24 hours begin with fresh breezes from S.W. at
1 P.M. stored the cables at 2 P.M. took a squall from the
North took in the light sail with heavy rain & strong S.W.
at 5 PM. P.M. weather quite fair wind from W.S.W. at 10 PM. down
the Cape bearing N.E. about 12 miles distant Middle part
part wind blowing into S.W. P.M. took ship heading from
W.S.W. at 11 PM. Latter part at 11 P.M. a fair breeze equal
wind from the W.S.W. took ship heading to the Southward
with fine weather

W.S.W. heading to the Southward Middle
part much the same Latter part squally & raining with thunder
& lightning fresh wind from S.W. heading S.W. ends with
light breezes & pleasant weather from Westward Set by Ob 1.16
Long by Obs 2.03.6

Tuesday 26th
these 24 hours begin with a calm at 12 M. P.M. saw a school
of Black fish landed but had poor success at 2 P.M. took a light
breeze from the S.W. Ship heading W.S.W. weather pleasant
Middle part wind blowing ship heading in different tacks
Latter part wind from S.W. Ship heading W.S.W. Set by Ob 1.22
Long by Obs 2.00

Wednesday 27th
these 24 hours begin with moderate winds from S.W.
Ship heading W.S.W. Middle part blowing breezes
& squally Ship heading to the S.W. Latter part raining
Ship heading to the S.W. ends with pleasant weather
Set by Ob 1.23.8
Long by Obs 2.13.6

Thursday 28th
these 24 hours begin with light breezes from the S.W.
Ship heading to the Westward Middle & Latter part light
and variable wind Ship heading in different tacks
heading to the Southward Set by Ob 1.31.8
Long by Obs 2.13.6

Friday 29th
these 24 hours begin with light winds from S.W. weather
pleasant Ship heading to the westward at 10 PM. down
Ship heading to the S.W. Middle part heading in different tacks
Latter part light breezes from the Northward strong S.W. Set by Ob 2.01
Long by Obs 2.00

Saturday 30th
these 24 hours begin with light pleasant breezes from the S.W. heading
to the Southward Middle part moderate breezes heading S.W.
Latter part strong breezes S.W. Retarded Ship heading to the S.W.
ends the same Set by Ob 2.48.6 Long by Obs 2.48.6
