These 24 hours begins with strong S.W. winds & rugged ship
under our sail all hands employed in stowing down sail at sun-
down finished at sail ship heading S E Middle put the same
Latter put at daylight hooked ship heading S.W. Lat by Obs 14.30
Long by Obs 74.3

Thursday 19th

These 24 hours begins with strong S winds and rugged
Ship heading S.W. at sundown hooked the canvas Middle
& Latter put at daylight at the fore sail ship heading to
the Westward Lat by Obs 15.13
Long by Obs 75.8

Friday 20th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the S
at 10 A.M. steered N.E. by N with Top sails & fore sail
at 12 P.M. wore new main braces at sundown luffed in
the wind under our sail heading S.W. Middle put
at 12 P.M. wore ship Latter put at mid steered N.E. by N
at 10 A.M. went fore top sail for repairs. Lat by Obs 15.02
Long by Obs 76.34

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S.W. ship heading
to the Southward weather smother at 3 P.M. bent the fore top sail
at sundown shortened ship heading S.W. Middle at 12 P.M. wore ship
Latter put at daylight steered S.W. by S Lat by Obs 14.32
Long by Obs 77.08

Tuesday 24th

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.W. at
12 P.M. steered N.W. by W water employed in repairing spinnaker
at 10 A.M. wore ship & short sail heading S.E. Middle & Latter
put much the same as first put Lat by Obs 14.34
Long by Obs 77.14

Wednesday 25th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from S.W.
Ship heading S.E. at sundown shortened sail Middle put
fresh breezes at 3 P.M. wore ship Latter put at daylight
steered N.W. by W at 11 A.M. wore new fore sail so ends Lat by Obs
Long by Obs

Thursday 26th

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.W. steered
Ship North at sundown shortened sail & luffed by the wind heading
S.E. Middle & Latter put strong breezes & ruged at day
light steered N.W. by W so ends Lat by Obs
Long by Obs

Friday 27th

These 24 hours begins with strong S.W. winds &
sailed at 1 P.M. steered N.E. with fore sail & fore
sail at 10 A.M. wore new fore sail luffed by the wind
Ship heading S.W. Middle & Latter put strong breezes
at daylight at 12 P.M. so ends Lat by Obs 12.31
Long by Obs 77.44
