

Remarks on board of Bark Marion of Red

Thursday June 3rd 1838.

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.W. weather
smoke ship heading S.E. Middle & latter part pleasant
breezes ship heading S.E. Lat by Obs 3, 04, S

Long by Chron 2, 30 E

Friday 4th

These 24 hours begins with pleasant breezes from S.W. ship
heading S.E. Middle part pleasant latter part variable
breezes at 8 A.M. tacked ship heading from N.W. to S.W.
and a fair back so ends Lat by

Obs 1, 30 S

Saturday 5th

These 24 hours begins light breezes from the S.E. ship heading
from S.W. to S.E. by S. Middle and latter part much the same

Long by Chron 1, 22, E

Lat by Obs 6, 18, S

Sunday 6th

These 24 hours begins with light & pleasant breezes from the S.
at 1 P.M. tacked ship heading S.E. by E. Middle & latter
part at day light tacked ship heading N.W. Lat by Obs 6, 42

Long by Chron 2, 35

Monday 7th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the S. ship
heading S.E. by E. saw porpoises caught 1. Middle & latter
part heading on different tacks so ends. Lat by Obs 7, 06

Long by Chron 10, 30

Tuesday 8th

These 24 hours begins with light breezes & variable
ship heading on different tacks saw Porpoises Middle
& latter part light breezes & calm ship heading Lat by Obs 8, 10

Long by Chron 11, 03

Wednesday 9th

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from S.W. at 6 P.M. ship
& gained the S.W. Cape of Hope Capt Dilger 11 miles the wind
at 9 P.M. finished coming, set all sail ship heading S.W. Middle
& latter part light air, intermediate ship heading
to the Westward Lat by Obs 1, 28 S

Redford Alfred C Davis Master 1838

Thursday June 10th 1838

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the Southward
Ship heading N.W. Middle & latter part light & variable
winds ship heading to the Westward so ends Lat by Obs 2, 30

Long by Chron 10, 40

Friday 11th

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S.W.
Ship heading to the Westward. Middle & latter part much
the same as first part Lat by Obs 2, 30 S

Long by Chron 9, 32 E

Saturday 12th

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S.W.
Ship heading to the Westward but sun down tacked ship
heading S.W. Middle part heading to the S.E. & latter part
Ship heading to the Westward so ends Lat by Obs 3, 12

Long by Chron 8, 44

Sunday 13th

These 24 hours begins with variable breezes from Southward
Ship heading to the Westward at sundown tacked ship heading
S.E. by S. Middle part fresh breezes latter part light air
Ship heading to the Westward Lat by Obs 3, 22 S

Long by Chron 9, 28 E

Monday 14th

These 24 hours begins with moderate & variable breezes from
S.W. Westward tacked ship heading S.E. Middle part
much the same latter part heading on different tacks, Lat by Obs 3, 52

Long by Chron 8,

Tuesday 15th

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.W. ship head-
ing S.E. weather smoky Middle & latter part light breezes
Ship heading to windward so ends Lat by Obs 3, 13

Long by Chron 10, 35

Wednesday 16th

These 24 hours begins with light & buffing breezes from S.W. ship
heading to the Westward at 2 1/2 P.M. saw many birds however
but did not shoot Middle & latter part moderate & buffing
breezes ship heading to the Westward watch completed Lat by Obs 3, 28
